SUBJECT: RETROACTIVE APPROVAL OF BOGGINI PARK COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP SPONSORED BY COUNCIL DISTRICT 8 AS A CITY COUNCIL SPONSORED SPECIAL EVENT TO EXPEND CITY FUNDS AND ACCEPT DONATIONS OF MATERIALS AND SERVICES FOR THE EVENT

RECOMMENDATION

1. Retroactively approve the Boggini Park Community Clean-Up scheduled on February 10th, 2018 as a City Council sponsored Special Event and approve the expenditure of funds,
2. Approve and accept donations from various individuals, businesses or community groups to support the event,
3. Place the item on the April 17th, 2018 Council Agenda for action.

BACKGROUND

On February 1, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution 72517 which requires Councilmembers to submit a memorandum to the Rules Committee regarding proposed City Council sponsored Special Events and the proposed use of any funds.

Boggini Park Community Clean-Up was held on February 10, 2018 at Boggini Park and sponsored by Councilmember Arenas. This special event brought community members to their local park for a beautification and clean-up day. The event was free and open to the public.

ANALYSIS

Retroactive approval by the City Council of the event will ensure compliance with the Council's prior direction regarding Council Special Events. In observance of existing fundraising disclosure requirements, Councilmember Arenas will report any cash or in-kind donations received for the event on their Disclosure of Fundraising Report (DFR-1). Retroactive approval of this memorandum will enable Council District 8, City departments and the Office of the City

Clerk to proceed with the event. Any cash donations received will be processed pursuant to the City's normal financial and budgetary procedures.


