CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION LIMITS

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a resolution approving the campaign contribution limits adjusted in accordance with San José Municipal Code Section 12.06.210.E.

OUTCOME

Approval of the recommendation will update the campaign contribution limits to adjust for any cost of living increase, as required under San Jose Municipal Code ("SJMC") Section 12.06.210.E, for the Primary Municipal Election on June 2, 2026 and the Run-off Municipal Election on November 3, 2026.

If the resolution is adopted, the contribution limit for candidates, except the Mayor, running for City Council in 2026 will increase to \$800.00 per donor. The mayoral contribution limit and the Total Election Contest or Recount contribution limits for council member candidates will increase to \$1,600.00 per donor (See SJMC § 12.06.210.E.2.)

BACKGROUND

On March 5, 2019, the City Council adopted Ordinance 30231 amending section 12.06.210 of Title 12 of the San José Municipal Code (SJMC) in response to the State moving up the statewide primary election to March of even numbered years.

As amended, Section 12.06.210.E directs the City Clerk to determine 280 days before the regularly scheduled primary municipal election if the cost of living, as shown on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the San Francisco-Oakland-Hayward area, has increased during the "adjustment period." The "adjustment period" is the CPI reported for the month of December 2010 and the CPI reported for the month that is at least two hundred and eighty days (280) days before the regularly scheduled primary municipal election. If the CPI has increased for the applicable "adjustment period," the City Clerk must multiply the current contributions limits by the percentage increase for the adjustment period. If the calculation results in an amount that is higher than the previously established contribution limits, when rounded to the nearest \$100.00, the City Clerk is to recommend that the City Council adopt a resolution adjusting the

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contribution limits. If the Council adopts the resolution, the City Clerk is to publish the adjusted contribution limits at least 190 days before the regularly scheduled primary municipal election.

ANALYSIS

On August 27, 2025, 280 days before the June 2, 2026 election, the City Clerk accessed the reported CPI through the Bureau of Labor Statistics: https://www.bls.gov/regions/west/news-release/consumerpriceindex_sanfrancisco.htm. The CPI change is calculated by subtracting the CPI from December 2010 from the current CPI, then dividing to find the percentage change. That percentage change is then applied to the base contribution limit of \$500.
