SUBJECT: Report on Bids and Award of Contract for the 10294 - Southwest

Expressway Sanitary Sewer Improvement Project

RECOMMENDATION

- (a) Report on bids and award of contract for the construction of 10294 Southwest Expressway Sanitary Sewer Improvement Project to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, Koios Engineering, Inc. in the amount of \$4,420,145; and
- (b) Approve a 10% contingency in the amount of \$442,014.

SUMMARY AND OUTCOME

This memorandum summarizes the bids received and requests the award of a contract for the construction of the 10294 - Southwest Expressway Sanitary Sewer Improvement Project (Project).

Award of the contract to Koios Engineering, Inc. will enable the Project to proceed into construction to provide added capacity to the existing sewer system. Approval of a 10% contingency provides funding for any unanticipated work necessary for the proper completion or construction of the Project.

BACKGROUND

This Project was initially developed by the Public Works Department Master Plan division as part of the Sanitary Sewer Master Plan Phase III report. The Master Plan team evaluated the current capacity of the sanitary sewer system in the project area and compared it with projected future demands based on the City's Envision San José

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2040 General Plan. The analysis concluded that capacity upgrades are needed to accommodate anticipated increases in sewer flows.

This Project will upsize approximately 800 linear feet of existing eight-inch sanitary sewer main to a 15-inch main along Fruitdale Avenue, between Southwest Expressway and Meridian Avenue. In addition, approximately 4,200 linear feet of new 10-inch sanitary sewer main will be installed. Also included in the Project is the removal and replacement of six sanitary sewer manholes and the construction of 14 new sanitary sewer manholes. The Project limits are within City Council District 6, as shown in the attached Project Location Map (Attachment A).

Construction is scheduled to begin in January 2026 with substantial completion in September 2026.

ANALYSIS

Bids were opened on May 15, 2025, with the following results:

Procurement Issues

The bids submitted by KJ Woods Construction, Inc. and Mitchell Engineering were deemed non-responsive for failing to submit California Air Resource Board Certificates of Reported Compliance for their subcontractors' fleets.

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Bid Price Analysis

The lowest bid, submitted by Koios Engineering, Inc. is 16% below the Engineer's Estimate. The price for installing pipe, specifically the price related to the jack and bore operation, had the greatest variance from the Engineer's Estimate. This work, though common practice, is unique to the Project and is not typical of most sanitary sewer improvement projects completed by the City in recent years. Because it falls outside the scope of what is typically delivered, the associated cost estimate was higher. Staff considers the low bid to be acceptable for the work involved.

Contractor Responsibility Analysis

Koios Engineering, Inc. has successfully completed multiple sanitary sewer projects for different municipalities including San José, Berkeley, Mill Valley and the Town of Corte Madera.

Contingency

San José Municipal Code Section 27.04.050 provides for a standard contingency of 10% on all Public Works contracts except those involving the renovation of a building or buildings. The standard 10% contingency is appropriate for this Project.

Wage Theft Prevention Policy Check

The Office of Equality Assurance reviewed bidders for compliance with the City's Wage Theft Prevention Policy on May 15, 2025 and on July 10, 2025. No wage theft issues were identified.

Project Labor Agreement Applicability

The City's Project Labor Agreement is applicable to this Project because the Engineer's Estimate is over \$1.2 million.

Local and Small Business Analysis

The recommended contractor is not a local business or a small business enterprise. Two local business enterprises were listed as subcontractors. McKim Corporation (Gilroy) will be performing asphalt work valued at approximately \$221,000 and Bear Electrical Solutions (Alviso) will be installing loop detectors valued at approximately \$15,000.

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EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

No additional follow up action with the City Council is expected at this time.

COST SUMMARY/IMPLICATIONS

This Project is consistent with the City Council-approved Budget Strategy Economic Recovery section in that it will spur construction spending in our local economy. The source of funding for this Project is through the 545 Sewer Service and Use Charge Capital Improvement Fund and the 540 Sanitary Sewer Connection Fee Fund. The Project will have no significant adverse impact on the Sewer Service and Use Charge Fund or General Fund operating budgets.



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A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE ADOPTING THE PHASE III SANITARY SEWER MASTER PLAN ADDENDUM (FILE NO. ER22-287) TO THE ENVISION SAN JOSE 2040 GENERAL PLAN FINAL PROGRAM ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT AND SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT, ALL IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT, AS AMENDED

WHEREAS, the City of San José ("City") acting as lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970, together with state and local guidelines implementing said Act, all as amended to date (collectively "CEQA"), prepared the Final Program Environmental Impact Report for the Envision San José 2040 General Plan ("2040 General Plan FPEIR") which analyzed the environmental impacts set forth from the land use and development assumptions of the Envision San José 2040 General Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City certified said 2040 General Plan FPEIR on November 1, 2011, which certification was not appealed; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the adoption of a resolution approving said Envision San José 2040 General Plan (Planning File No. PP09-011), the City Council adopted Resolution No. 76041 on November 1, 2011, setting forth certain findings pertaining to the 2040 General Plan FPEIR and adopting a mitigation monitoring and reporting program, all pursuant to the provisions of CEQA; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to said actions on the 2040 General Plan FPEIR, the City prepared, completed, and adopted in accordance with CEQA the Supplemental Environmental Impact Report ("SEIR") for the Envision San José 2040 General Plan, Greenhouse Gas Reduction Strategy (Planning File No. PP15-060); and

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WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City certified said SEIR on December 2,

2015 which certification was not appealed; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 77617 on December 15, 2015,

setting forth certain findings pertaining to the SEIR, all pursuant to the provisions of

CEQA; and

WHEREAS, prior to the adoption of this Resolution, the Planning Director of the City of

San José prepared an Addendum to the 2040 General Plan FPEIR and SEIR for the

Phase III Sanitary Sewer Master Plan Project under Planning File No. ER22-287 (the

"Addendum"), all in accordance with CEQA; and

WHEREAS, the Phase III Sanitary Sewer Master Plan Project (the "Project") analyzed

under the Addendum consists of identification of 76 individual capital improvement

projects, and four alternative projects, to address existing sewer system capacity

improvement needs per the San José City Council Sewer Level of Service Policy 8-7, and

to provide for planned future growth as outlined in the adopted Envision San José 2040

General Plan, in San José, California; and

WHEREAS, as further described in the Addendum, the implementation of the Project

would not result in new significant effects on the environment beyond those already

identified in the previously approved 2040 General Plan FPEIR, and SEIR, nor will the

Project result in an increase in the severity of significant effects identified in the 2040

General Plan FPEIR, and SEIR; and

WHEREAS, the City of San José is the lead agency on the Project, and the City Council

is the decision-making body for the proposed approval to undertake the Project; and

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WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed and considered the 2040 General Plan FPEIR,

SEIR and the Addendum, and intends to take actions on the Project in compliance with

CEQA and state and local guidelines implementing CEQA; and

WHEREAS, the 2040 General Plan FPEIR, SEIR and the Addendum thereto are on file

in the Office of the Director of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement, located at 200

East Santa Clara Street, 3rd Floor Tower, San José California, 95113, are available for

inspection by any interested person at that location and on the Department of Planning,

Building and Code Enforcement website, and are, by this reference, incorporated into this

Resolution as if fully set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN

JOSE:

THAT THE CITY COUNCIL incorporates the foregoing recitals into this Resolution.

THAT THE CITY COUNCIL does hereby make the following findings: (1) it has

independently reviewed and analyzed the 2040 General Plan FPEIR, and SEIR, as all

modified by the Addendum, as well as other information in the record and has considered

the information contained therein, prior to acting upon or approving the Project, (2) the

Addendum modifying the 2040 General Plan FPEIR, and SEIR prepared for the Project

has been completed in compliance with CEQA and is consistent with state and local

guidelines implementing CEQA, and (3) the Addendum modifying the 2040 General Plan

FPEIR, and SEIR represents the independent judgment and analysis of the City of San

José, as lead agency for the Project. The City Council designates the Director of

Planning, Building and Code Enforcement at the Director's Office at 200 East Santa Clara

Street, 3rd Floor Tower, San José, California, 95113, as the custodian of documents and

records of proceedings on which this decision is based.

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THAT THE CITY COUNCIL does hereby find that based upon the entire record of proceedings before it and all information received that there is no substantial evidence that the Project will have a significant effect on the environment and does hereby adopt the Addendum prepared for the Project (Planning File No. ER22-287). The 2040 General Plan FPEIR, SEIR and the Addendum are: (1) on file in the Office of the Director of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement, located at 200 East Santa Clara Street, 3rd Floor Tower, San José, California, 95113, and on the Department of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement website, and (2) available for inspection by any interested person.
