## ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE AMENDING PART 48 OF CHAPTER 2.08 OF TITLE 2 OF THE SAN JOSE MUNICIPAL CODE TO ADD SECTION 2.08.4835, AND TO AMEND SECTIONS 2.08.4840 AND 2.08.4850, AND TO MAKE OTHER CONFORMING CHANGES

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions and requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970, together with related State CEQA Guidelines and Title 21 of the San José Municipal Code (collectively, "CEQA"), the Director of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement has determined that the provisions of this Ordinance do not constitute a project, under File No. PP17-008 (General Procedure and Policy Making resulting in no changes to the physical environment); and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of San José is the decision-making body for this Ordinance; and

**WHEREAS**, this Council has reviewed and considered the "not a project" determination under CEQA prior to taking any approval actions on this Ordinance;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN** JOSE:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. Chapter 2.08 of Title 2 of the San José Municipal Code is amended by adding a Section to be numbered and entitled and to read as follows:

2.08.4835 - Special provisions.

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Commencing November 1, 2023, each member who serves on the Youth Commission shall be paid the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) per meeting if they have attended.

This compensation shall be in addition to any reimbursement for expenses incurred in the performance of the Commissioners' duties and functions under Section 2.08.120(B).

<u>SECTION 2</u>. Section 2.08.4840 of Chapter 2.08 of Title 2 of the San José Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

## 2.08.4840 Special eligibility requirements.

- All members shall, at the time of appointment, be at least fourteen years old and under twenty-one years old.
- B. The Commission shall have members representative of the residents of the City of San Jose, and with experience related to programs and services with school or community activities for children and youth.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. Section 2.08.4850 of Chapter 2.08 of Title 2 of the San José Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

## 2.08.4850 Functions, powers, and duties.

The commission shall have the following functions, powers, and duties:

- A. \_\_\_To foster greater involvement of youth in municipal government and civic affairs, especially in the City of San José.
- A.B. To comment and make recommendations to the City Council and the City

  Manager's Office on matters within the Commission's workplan, and the City of

  San Jose Children and Youth Master Plan.

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- B.C. To study, review, evaluate, advise and submit recommendations to City Council or the City manager pertaining to the effects of legislative policies, needs, assessments, priorities, programs, and budgets any problems, activities and concerns of youth as they relate to municipal policies, programs or projects of the city.
- C.D. To conduct forums and sponsor events on topics included in the Commission's workplan with governmental and nongovernmental agencies, community organizations, or fraternal or benevolent associations. make such studies of any other problems, activities and concerns of youth in any field as, in the judgment of the commission, aid in effectuating its general purposes.
- D. To hold and conduct forums on such problems, activities and concerns of youth in which various governmental and nongovernmental agencies and other community organizations, fraternal and benevolent associations may be invited to participate, to the extent the commission deems such desirable.
- E. To select and designate members of the eCommission, youths or other persons to act as commission representatives to all other city boards and commissions, and to agencies, authorities, boards and commissions the city has participated in creating in conformance with guidelines approved by the council.
- F. To make such recommendations to the council as the commission may find necessary and desirable to carry out the purposes for which the commission is established.
- G. To cosponsor the annual San José City Hall youth-in-government day program.
- H. To conduct or sponsor activities the commission deems desirable and in the interests of the youth of the city consistent with the Charter, other provisions of this Code, other ordinances, resolutions and other acts of the council.
