#### **BACKGROUND**

Council Policy 0-4, the Consolidated Policy Governing Boards and Commissions, allows the Department staff liaison for the Commission to submit a memo to the City Clerk with its evaluation of applicant(s) based on the powers and duties of the Commission, any special eligibility requirements, and experience, background, and expertise of the applicant(s). For any incumbents eligible for reappointment, the memo should include a statement setting forth attendance, residency information, and compliance with City requirements (e.g., commission training, State-mandated training, Form 700 filing).

#### **COMMISSION'S SPECIAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

San José Municipal Code Section 2.08.2820 describes the special eligibility requirements for the Housing and Community Development Commission (Commission):

- One (1) member shall be a person recommended by an organization of owners of San José mobilehome parks.
- One (1) member shall be a person recommended by an organization of residents of San José mobilehome parks.
- One (1) member shall be an owner or manager of a residential rent stabilized property.
- One (1) member shall be a tenant of a residential rent stabilized rental unit.
- One (1) member shall be a person who is currently or was formerly homeless.
- At least five (5) members shall represent low-income households, which for the purposes of this requirement means a person who meets one (1) or more of the following criteria:

- 1. The person is a member of a low- or moderate-income household as defined by HUD as at or below eighty percent of the area median income pursuant to 24 CFR 92.2.
- 2. The person is an elected member of a neighborhood organization in a lowor moderate-income neighborhood (fifty-one percent of the neighborhood is at or below eighty percent of the area median income as defined by HUD).
- 3. The person is a resident of a city council designated neighborhood targeted under the place-based neighborhoods initiative to receive federal funding.
- 4. The person is employed by an organization which has as its primary purpose to serve the interests of low-income residents.
- The commission should also include members with experience related to real estate development, lending, community development, homeless services, and federal funding.

### **APPOINTMENT PRIORITIES**

Upon review, it has been determined that the Commission currently does not meet the full special eligibility requirements of the San José Municipal Code. The requirements and corresponding recommendations to address the vacant positions are as follows:

 Low-income households: Per SJMC 2.08.2820 (E), at least five commissioners must meet the low-income household definition, and currently only four seated commissioners do. Therefore, at least one commissioner that meet the lowincome household definition (above) shall be selected from this applicant pool.

In addition, there are currently five commissioner vacancies on the Housing and Community Development Commission: District 3, District 4, District 6, and District 8.

#### <u>APPLICANT ASSESSMENTS AND RECOMMENDATION</u>

The following recommendations are made based on the indicated experience and response to the application prompts. Commissioners are appointed by corresponding Council Members, but do not need to reside in that Council District.

- District 3 Seat: Esmeralda Bautista and Marika Buchholz
- District 4 Seat: Andrew Singleterry and Thoa Hoang
- District 6 Seat: Jennifer Cretella and Maharshi Patel
- District 8 Seat: Maharshi Patel and Oscar Quiroz-Medrano
