SUBJECT: ACTIONS RELATED TO THE PURCHASE ORDERS AND AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENTS WITH BAYSCAPE MANAGEMENT, INC., BRIGHTVIEW LANDSCAPE SERVICES, INC., AND JENSEN LANDSCAPE SERVICES, LLC FOR LANDSCAPING SERVICES

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager or her designee to:

- a) Negotiate and execute purchase orders with Bayscape Management, Inc. (Alviso, CA), Brightview Landscape Services, Inc. (Blue Bell, PA), and Jensen Landscape Services, LLC (Los Angeles, CA) for landscape management and maintenance services in public right-of-way locations in special districts to extend services for up to two additional oneyear option terms for a total of nine options through December 2, 2025, subject to the appropriation of funds; and
- b) Negotiate and execute purchase orders with Bayscape Management, Inc. (Alviso, CA), Brightview Landscape Services, Inc. (Blue Bell, PA) for landscape management, maintenance, and irrigation services at various City locations to extend services for up to two additional one-year option terms for a total of six options through December 19, 2025, subject to the appropriation of funds; and
- c) Negotiate and execute the Second Amendment to the Agreement with Bayscape Management, Inc. (Alviso, CA) for landscape management and maintenance services for General Fund and Special District landscape areas to extend services for up to two additional one-year option terms for a total of nine options through December 3, 2025, subject to the appropriation of funds; and
- d) Negotiate and execute the First Amendment to the Agreement with Bayscape Management, Inc. (Alviso, CA) for landscape maintenance services for civic grounds and small parks to extend services for up to one additional one-year option term for a total of six options through February 28, 2025, subject to the appropriation of funds.

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SUMMARY AND OUTCOME

Authorizing the City Manager or her designee to take this action will allow the City to continue to receive landscaping services.

BACKGROUND

The Departments of Environmental Services, Parks, Recreation, and Neighborhood Services, Public Works, and Transportation are responsible for overseeing landscaping services at various locations Citywide. The services required include routine landscape maintenance such as the trimming, removal, irrigation, and planting of vegetation along with integrated pest management. Services are utilized by departments as needed to preserve landscapes in the public right-of-way and other City locations. As a result of multiple competitive solicitations, the initial awards for these services were approved by City Council in December 2013¹, December 2014², February 2018³, and December 2018⁴. An extension of the contracts and purchase orders for these landscaping services was authorized by City Council in May 2021⁵ with the last option terms ending in December 2023. The below table provides a synopsis of the history and status of the awards.

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ANALYSIS

On September 19, 2016, then-Governor Jerry Brown signed Senate Bill 1383 into law, which established methane emissions reduction targets in a statewide effort to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants by reducing organic waste disposal in various sectors of California's economy. Senate Bill 1383 created new regulations that affect the procurement of recycled organic products such as compost, mulch, and materials used in landscaping services. At the time of enactment, Senate Bill 1383 regulations were contemplated to be effective on January 1, 2022.

As noted in its May 6, 2021 memorandum to the City Council, at that time, staff had been developing a comprehensive solicitation to cover all necessary landscaping management and maintenance services for the City. Given the new law, staff suspended its solicitation development to review and understand the new requirements and provisions of Senate Bill 1383. Staff has been working with City stakeholders over the past few years to consolidate City landscaping services needs and incorporate relevant Senate Bill 1383 requirements into a new Citywide solicitation.

City staff completed its review of those regulations and are now able to resume efforts on the new competitive solicitation. The landscaping services solicitation currently in development will incorporate requirements needed to comply with Senate Bill 1383. Approval of this recommendation will ensure the City continues to receive these services with minimal impact to operations pending completion of the new solicitation.

EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

This memorandum will not require any follow-up from staff.

COST SUMMARY/IMPLICATIONS

The table below identifies:

- 1. The total amount of the purchase orders for the eighth option term for the period of December 3, 2023 through December 2, 2024, for the Department of Transportation;
- 2. The total amount of the purchase orders for the fifth option term for the period of December 20, 2023 through December 19, 2024, for the Departments of Environmental Services, Parks, Recreation, and Neighborhood Services, Public Works, and Transportation;

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- 3. The total amount of the contract for the eighth option term for the period of December 4, 2023 through December 3, 2024, for the Department of Transportation; and
- 4. The total amount of the contract for the sixth option term for the period of March 1, 2024 through February 28, 2025, for the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Neighborhood Services.

These services will be utilized as required and the total cost may vary depending on landscaping servicing needs. Ongoing annual costs for services will be requested as part of the City's annual budget process and will be subject to the appropriation of funds.
