San José already has difficulty maintaining its current parks, let alone opening new parks. Developers routinely get away with including "green space" in developments, where the public is not genuinely welcome, in lieu of contributing to the support of parks that all residents can use. Open space at schools is not accessible to the public during the school day, and sometimes not even outside school hours either.
