Recommendations

- ■\$752,500 for Round 3 grant awards
 - \$182,000 from Digital Inclusion Fund
 - \$217,750 from unspent Round 1 & 2 funds
 - \$352,750 from matching donations
- ■\$35,000 from donations to fund extra Round 2 adoptions
- Amend City agreement with CETF to allow:
 - One-time \$20,000 payment for COVID-19 grant making support
 - Up to \$72,500 one-time payment for program assessment and transition management, if needed
 - Enables up to \$92,500 paid from Digital Inclusion Fund
 - In addition to CETF annual compensation (\$190k/year)



Digital Adoption Demographics








- Round 2
 - Preliminary outcomes by June 30, 2022 end of grant term
 - Final outcomes by fall 2022
 - CBOs must achieve all Adoptions for release of Round 3 award
- Round 3
 - Commences on July 1, 2022
 - Future rounds paused pending program assessment
- Digital Inclusion Fund Program Assessment
 - Begin in spring 2022 complete by spring 2023
- Status reports
 - Grants and Assessment update to City Council in fall 2022/winter 2023
 - Recommend "next phase" model to City Council in spring 2023
