

Access for All

Increase transportation education, affordability, options and use of driving alternatives, especially in historically underserved communities and for people with limited mobility.



Enjoyable Transportation

Make getting around pleasant, easy, reliable and appealing



Plan for the Future

Use the newest ideas to keep the transportation system modern, fair, and effective; and maintain it.



Clean the Air

Reduce pollution from cars and trucks



Less Driving

Have more travel choices so trips can be made without driving



Connected Neighborhoods

Make it easy to get between neighborhoods and to major destinations by foot, bike, bus, rail, and other shared options



Transportation Safety

Maintain and make improvements to the bike, walk, roll, and transit system to support Vision Zero, prioritizing the personal security of the most vulnerable populations first



Move the **Economy**

Provide access to diverse jobs by sustainable modes, support goods to market, and support job growth in San José.



20-Minute Neighborhoods

Create great places so it is easy to run errands and get to schools and parks without a car



Encourage/Allow Car Share

- Since 2020 we have seen slight positive shifts in commuters who carpool and walk.
- But there has been stagnation in bike commuters and declines in commuters taking public transit.
- Common hurdles to getting people to shift from driving alone: safety, access, cost, convenience/connectivity.





























- Transportation Safety and Access for All goals are identified as low performing areas for 6 of 10 council districts.
- Indicators like stress level and % of non-driving trips has pushed DOT to invest in more lowstress bike facilities and better transit facilities.






Transit-First Policy

- > Puts transit riders' best interests first in design discussions.
- > Accelerated the transit signal priority (TSP) initiative throughout the VTA Frequent Bus Route network.
 - Pilot project improved route performance by up to 20 percent.
 - > Formally deployed on 3 out of 20 routes.
 - > Decreased time spent at red lights by **up to 50%**.
 - > Increased likelihood of passing through a green light without stopping by **up to 23%.**
- > Has also informed complete street redesign projects.























Parking Policy Update



PARKING STRATEGY

Right-size the parking supply to avoid building excess parking spaces and incentivizing driving over alternatives



TRANSPORTATION DEMAND **MANAGEMENT STRATEGIES**

Manage demand for parking by providing high-quality alternatives to driving, such as walking, biking, and transit
