

Fw: Councilmember Peralez "end the mandate" memo







To the Mayor and City Councilmembers,

We are writing on behalf of our family neighbors, and City Employees especially the First Responders in the Police and Fire Department who hare our belief

The past two years have been challenging in so many ways. San Jose City Councilmember Raul Peralez recognizes this fact and has crafted a resolution contained in his memorandum dated February 10, 2022 The memo to the Mayor and City Council recommends a transition from the City of San Jose's vaccine and booster mandate policy to a testing policy for employees.

We believe this course of action will prevent unnecessary punishment and potential loss of hundreds of dedicated employees which will further reduce in the City's ability to provide core services and maintain Police and Fire's ability to provide for the public's safety.

We write to each of you in support of Councilmember Peralez's memo for a sensible transition without the loss of employees, services and the fiscal impact resulting from having to backfill positions, hire, and train new employees.
