Policy Change: Category Descriptions

Extremely Low- Income	 Predevelopment, acquisition, construction, operating costs/reserves, permanent financing Acquisition/rehab, preservation Limited commercial space (ex: childcare facilities) For-sale and rental housing programs Minimum 20-year restriction
Low-Income	Same as above
Moderate-Income	Same as above
Homeless Prevention and Rental Assistance	 Homeless prevention, gender-based violence programs, legal services, rental assistance, casemanagement
Homeless Services	 Outreach teams/encampment services, safe parking, employment programs, case management Interim housing construction and operations



Policy Change: Allocation Percentages

Spending Category	Current %	Proposed %	2021-2022 (\$90M)	2022-2023 (\$65M)
Extremely Low- Income Households	45%	40%	\$35.2M	\$24.7M
Low-Income Households	35%	30%	\$26.4M	\$18.5M
Moderate-Income Households	10%	5%	\$4.4M	\$3M
Homeless Prevention	10%	10%	\$8.8M	\$6.17M
Homeless Support Programs	N/A	15%	\$13.2M	\$9.2M

Impact on Funding for Interim Housing

15% Homeless Support - \$6.2 million available ongoing to support Interim Housing

In addition to other Federal and State funding sources, additional contributions will be necessary from a combination of American Rescue Plan and General Fund sources

Model Scenarios	Estimated American Rescue Plan Fund Contributions	<i>Estimated</i> General Fund
Current Sites (Operations)	\$0	\$4 million 2029-2030
Current Sites + Pending Project HomeKey (Operations)	\$10 million 2022-2023	\$2 - \$12 million 2025-2026 to 2029-2030
Current Sites + Pending Project HomeKey + Four New EIH Sites (Construction and Operations)	\$20 million 2022-2023	\$20 million 2022-2023 \$5 - \$32 million 2023-2024 to 2029-2030
