1. Senior Commission and Parks and Recreation Commission Work Plans.

1. Children and Youth Services Master Plan Status Report.

He also requested that the Administration look into other possible locations for the pilot programs, which sites are being selected, and how hot spots/ opportunity neighborhoods are functioning.
