4. COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

4.1 18-1375 Actions Related to the Agreement with LifeMoves for the Safe Parking Pilot Program.

Recommendation:

Adopt a resolution:

- (a) Authorizing the Director of Housing to execute an agreement with LifeMoves in the amount of \$250,000 from the Housing Trust Fund to operate a Safe Parking Pilot Program for families from October 16, 2018 through June 30, 2019 at the Seven Trees Community Center overflow parking lot.
- (b) Approving an exception to Council Policy 6-16 for this Safe Parking Pilot Program. CEQA: Categorically Exempt, CEQA Guidelines Section 15301, Existing Facilities, File No. PP18-076. Council District 7. (Housing)

Resolution No. 78830 Adopted.

Approved as Recommended, including approval of the joint Memorandum from Mayor Liccardo with Councilmembers Jones, Davis, Nguyen and Arenas to:

- 1. Accept staff recommendations and
- 2. Report back on preliminary progress of the pilot during the upcoming Council discussion of HEAP funding, currently scheduled for November 27, 2018.

Also approved is the Memorandum from Councilmember Rocha to:

- 1. Direct LifeMoves (GRANTEE) to initiate the program with enrollment of up to seventeen (17) households immediately after receiving City Council approval.
- 2. Clarify that employment status or 'employability' are not factors in qualifying for enrollment in the Safe Parking Pilot Program.

This was modified with Councilmember Jimenez' friendly amendment to the motion that when staff comes back with the homeless emergency aid funding item it includes one to two additional safe parking sites that serve different populations other than families, and do a little bit more rather than just one site.

4.1 18-1375 Actions Related to the Agreement with LifeMoves for the Safe Parking (Cont'd)

This was further addended with approval of the following additions:

- 1) Clarify that non-participation in the "housing fund" would not by itself exclude an otherwise qualified family from participation in the safe parking program, and that saving 50% of income included in the community guidelines is goal and not a minimum.
- 2) Clarify that the "community guidelines" requirements can be relaxed by Lifemoves during the pilot as necessary to ensure a successful program that is not a shelter environment.
- 3) Require this item to report back to the first meeting of the Neighborhood Services Committee following a 60-day operation of the Safe Parking Pilot project, and again at the June 2019 NSE Committee meeting.
- 4) Request the Grantee to work with a service provider focused on children, such as First 5 to support the emotional and physical needs of children and families.

4.2 18-1376 Approval of the Project Labor Agreement.

Recommendation:

Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager to negotiate and execute a project labor agreement with the Santa Clara and San Benito Counties Building and Construction Trades Council for an initial term of five years and to require inclusion of the project labor agreement in certain City public works construction contracts exceeding \$3,000,000, a threshold that would be adjusted annually by the consumer price index.
