

YIS Impacts of COVID-19




Census 2020- San José had a 77% response rate Census 2020. Ranked #1 Nationally for cities with populations over 290K

- How are BEST services changing outcomes for Participants?

Measuring Success

- Grantee workbooks to evaluate agency output and compliance
- Participant surveys to evaluate participant satisfaction and psychosocial outcomes
- Consent forms to collect and evaluate education and criminal justice administrative Data relating to participant outcomes
- Challenge: Eliciting greater response from participant (survey and consent)






BEST Participant Outcomes

 - In development: Santa Clara County Probation Department and San José Unified School District
 - Re-engage Santa Clara County Office of Education for a comprehensive data sharing agreement
