- ❖ Al Incentive Grants: Co-led the development and promotion of the program which awarded \$175,000 in grants to four early-stage Al companies.









Fostering Thriving Business Districts

Business Corridor Highlights:

- The Alameda Community Benefit Improvement District formation, providing an estimated \$327K in annual funding for the corridor.
- 13 ribbon cuttings in seven neighborhood business districts.
- ❖ The City's Small Business Allies facilitated a record 3,000+ small business owners with stepby-step assistance on city permits, inspections, and business tax registrations in FY 2024-2025.
- Holiday Shop Local Campaign: Collaboration with Team San Jose, San Jose Downtown Association, and 12 local business associations.











- ❖ Facilitating Events: The Special Events Team facilitated more than 227 outdoor special event days this summer that drew more 770,000 people.
- 2025 Creative Ambassadors: Creative Ambassadors have hosted 25+ events, fostering active participation from residents.

- Entertainment Zone Launch
 - Pilot of Post Street Entertainment Zone in collaboration with Qmunity.

- ❖ San José Works Summer Work Experience Program: 345 San José youth from low-income and underserved communities received a professional learning experience related to a career of interest.
- Hiring Now Job Fair: More than 500 job seekers attended job fair hosted at the Mexican Heritage Plaza.

- Medical Assistance Training Program: 9-month certification training will support 15-17 San José residents with low-income status.
- Semiconductor Apprenticeships with Western Digital accepting applications through Nov. 26, 2025.








Accelerating a Thriving Downtown
