# **Background**

#### **Organized Retail Theft:**

**Definition (490.4 PC):** Two or more people acting in concert to steal merchandise with the intent to sell, exchange, or return the merchandise for value.

#### Nationwide:

- \$125.7 Billion in economic losses
- \$39.2 Billion in lost wages
- 8 out of 10 retailers reported increased incidents of violence and aggression this past year

#### California:

- \$19 Billion in economic losses to retailers
- Retailers closing stores in major cities

# **Background**

#### **Retail Theft:**

#### San José:

- 2021 Reported Retail Theft Cases: 4,610
- 2022 Reported Retail Theft Cases: 5,756
- 25% increase from 2021 to 2022

California State Budget Act of 2022: Organized Retail Theft Prevention Grant Program through Senate Bill 154 to prevent and respond to organized retail theft.

**July 7**, **2023** - SJPD Submitted a Grant Proposal for \$8.49 million for October 2023 through December 2026.

Over 100 applicants

September 14, 2023 – BSCC approved the grant.

One of 38 grantees

- Reduce organized retail theft within the City
- Increase successful criminal prosecutions
- Collaborate with allied agencies and retail partners

#### **Investigative Resources**

- Organized Retail Theft Detail
  - Financial Crimes Unit
  - 1 Full-Time Forensic Analyst (non-sworn)
  - 4 Part-Time Investigator/Analysts (non-sworn)
    - Investigate cases, gather intelligence, provide outreach to retail partners, track crime statistics and patterns, identify hotspots, identify and document best practices, etc.
    - Collaborate with the District Attorney's Office for prosecution
    - Provide training and intelligence to patrol and loss prevention
- Detectives (Sworn) Overtime
  - Apprehension and arrest of suspects, search warrants, suspect interviews, etc.





#### Field Resources

- Overtime Patrol Officers (Sworn)
  - Proactive patrol and retail crime enforcement
  - Deployed at malls and other hotspot locations
  - Timely response to critical Organized Retail Theft events
  - Deterrence and prevention
- Overtime Community Service Officers
- Timely response to cold crimes
  - Thorough initial investigations
  - Documentation and Investigation





#### **Technology Resources**

- 300 Automated License Plate Readers
- Assist in identification and apprehension
  - Strategically deployed for retail theft prevention, apprehension and prosecution
- Additional Forensic Technology
  - Latent Fingerprints workstation
  - Forensic Software and workstations
  - Vehicles and Radios, etc.
