Increasing Disability Access: OEDCA

staff continued outreach and promotion of the City's Disability Access Improvement Grants program, which helps small businesses pay for a Certified Access Specialist (CASp) report and to hire professionals to design and remove ADA barriers.

OEDCA hosted the quarterly meeting of the San José Small Business Advisory Committee on March 26, 2025. The mission of the Committee is to advocate for San José's small businesses, promote entrepreneurship, and continue to make San José an ideal place to do business.





Growing San José's Al and Semiconductor Ecosystem

- Plug and Play Al Center of Excellence: April 2, 2025 ribbon-cutting for the first Al-focused incubator of its kind in Downtown San José.
- Al Start-Up Incentive Grants: More than 80 applications received for program granting up to \$50,000 for early-stage AI startups that establish headquarters or operations in San José. Deadline to apply is May 15, 2025.
- Nokia's Semiconductor Fabrication Facility: Tour and press conference of Nokia's new facility in South San José with Congressman Panetta, Mayor Mahan and Councilmember Casey.
 - Facility supported by \$93 million federal CHIPS grant received with assistance and support from OEDCA.

Supporting an Enhanced Downtown Experience for Businesses, Residents and Visitors

Downtown and Regional Wayfinding:

- 92 new pedestrian-oriented and bike-focused signs installed.
- Downtown Walking Map updated and distributed to local hotels and arts venues.
- NVIDIA GTC 2025: More than 25,000 visitors to Downtown; increases in hotel stays, restaurant activity and visitors from out of state vs. NVIDIA 2024 numbers.
