#### 2.7 Amendment to the Master Consultant Agreement with BSI America Professional Services, Inc. for Environmental, Health, and Safety Services.

Approve the First Amendment to the Master Consultant Agreement with BSI America Professional Services, Inc. for environmental, health, and safety consultant services, increasing the amount of compensation by \$356,000 for a total maximum compensation not to exceed \$606,000. #### HEARD AFTER CONSENT CALENDAR

The City Council, as the Board of Commissioners of the City of San José Housing Authority, adopt a resolution:

- (a) Certifying that the Santa Clara County Housing Authority's Moving to Work Annual Plan for the federal fiscal year 2026 is, as drafted, consistent with the direction of the City of San José's 2020-2025 Consolidated Plan and compliant with Federal requirements; and
- (b) Authorizing the Executive Director of the Santa Clara County Housing Authority Board of Commissioners and the Chair of the Santa Clara County Housing Authority Board of Commissioners to execute documents required in connection with the federal Fiscal Year 2026 Moving to Work Annual Plan submittal in the name of the City of San José Housing Authority.

CEQA: Not a Project, File No. PP17-004, Government Funding Mechanism or Fiscal Activity with no commitment to a specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment. (Housing)

Erik Solivan, Director of Housing; and Angie Garcia-Nguyen; Deputy Executive Director, Santa Clara Housing Authority offered the presentation and responded to questions.

<u>Friendly Amendment</u>: Councilmember Carl Salas requested that the following language be *added* to the MTW plan in the *Relevance & Innovation* section: *the Housing Authority will expand its partnership with the City of San Jose to apply flexible funding to support operations to consider at least one additional interim housing site.* Including Housing Authority staff direction to report back to the Council within six months with updates on the progress of exploring the use of tenant-based vouchers, and opportunities to expand funding for additional interim housing sites. The Friendly Amendment was accepted by the maker of the motion.

<u>Action</u>: Upon motion by Councilmember Rosemary Kamei, seconded by Councilmember Carl Salas, and carried unanimously, **Resolution No. RES2025-79** was adopted, the Support for Federal Fiscal Year 2026 Moving to Work Annual Plan was accepted, including the following language *added* to the MTW plan in the *Relevance & Innovation* section: *the Housing Authority will expand its partnership with the City of San Jose to apply flexible funding to support operations to consider at least one additional interim housing site*. Also including Housing Authority staff direction to report back to the Council within six months with updates on the progress of exploring the use of tenant-based vouchers, and opportunities to expand funding for additional interim housing sites.
