



Friday, May 3

 Vehicular and pedestrian traffic in both the downtown and foothill corridors was moderate throughout most of the night. No traffic diversions or road closers were necessary. There was light side show activity throughout the night. Officers cleared a few parking lots where sideshow vehicles were gathering.

 Officers were released at around midnight as traffic flow was moderate and there were no notable areas of concern throughout the city.

Saturday, May 4

- Vehicular and pedestrian traffic in both the downtown and foothill corridors was moderate throughout most of the night. No traffic diversions or road closers were necessary. There was very little side show activity throughout the night.
- Officers were released at around 1 a.m. as traffic flow was moderate and there were no notable areas of concern throughout the city.

Sunday, May 5

- Vehicular and Pedestrian traffic heavy in early afternoon in both downtown and foothill corridor.
- At 1600 hours several hundred people went into the Story and King Road intersection.
- Over the course of the next few hours vehicular and pedestrian traffic significantly increased in both the downtown and foothill corridors.
- Full vehicle traffic diversions were activated in the downtown corridor by 1740 hours and in the foothill corridor by 1815 hours due to major traffic congestion and random side show activity at various intersections.

Sunday, May 5

- Sporadic sideshow activity began sprouting up throughout the city.
 Participants went to several different locations causing traffic issues, but a proactive response prevented things from fully materializing.
- The sideshow locations were:
 - Sierra Road and Lundy Ave
 - Montgomery Street and Santa Clara Street
 - McKee Road and Jackson Avenue
 - various intersections in the downtown corridor
