City of San José – Foreign Trade Zone 18 Grantee

- The Foreign Trade Zone is a federal program passed into law by Congress in 1934 to foster U.S. commerce and trade
- City applied and received federal approval in 1974 for the San José Foreign Trade Zone, the 18th Foreign Trade Zone established in the U.S.
- City administers the Foreign Trade Zone as a public benefit for San José and the region to facilitate economic growth, support jobs, manufacturing and trade

Foreign Trade Zone

- A site in the U.S., through federal designation, considered to be outside of a U.S. Customs area.
- Foreign merchandise is admitted into a Foreign Trade Zone duty free – duties are paid only if the merchandise enters into U.S. Customs area.
- A company is able to delay, reduce or eliminate federal duties on foreign merchandise that is admitted into a Foreign Trade Zone.

Whoever maliciously enters a Foreign-Trade Zone with the intent to unlawfully remove, or whoever unlawfully removes, any merchandise from U.S. Customs & Border Protection custody or control, or an interstate or foreign shipment, shall be guilty of a Federal crime and shall be fined not more than \$250,000 or imprisoned not more than 10 years, or both.


