1. **Call to Order/Roll Call/Introductions.** The Arena Authority convened the regular meeting of the Board of Directors at 4:06pm.
2. **General Business**
  - a. **Welcome New Arena Authority Board Member Selene Lenox and Mayor's Representative Jessica Barriga.** The Arena Authority welcomed the new Mayor's representative, Jessica Barriga, to the Board.
  - b. **Presentation on the Amended Arena Management Agreement.** Kevin Ice, Director of Real Estate, CMO and Cameron Day, City Attorney's Office, presented the Amended Arena Management Agreement primarily as it relates to the SAP Center and the Arena Authority Board's roles and responsibilities.
  - c. **Review and Approve June 25, 2025 Regular Board Meeting Minutes.** Approved with 6 approvals, 2 abstentions (Fetzer and Shikada). 1<sup>st</sup>: Montenegro, 2<sup>nd</sup>: Weekes.



### 3. Executive Director and Staff Reports

#### 3.1. Executive Director (Morrisey)

##### a. Accept Reports on Arena Authority Oversight.

- SAP Center at San Jose. Construction in and around the arena included a new concession stand along the concourse and the building of a 300-space parking lot on the corner of Barack Obama Boulevard and St. John Street. The Sharks opened the season against Las Vegas on October 9. At the home opener, a new Sharks Way was unveiled along St. John Street. The Golden State Valkyries played one playoff game at the arena against the Minnesota Lynx. In early November, Caltrain will be evaluating the foundations at the Santa Clara Street bridge. The 2025 National Women's Soccer League game is being held at Paypal Park on November 22. See notated agenda items 3.1.a.
- Sharks Ice at San Jose/Tech CU Arena (Verbal). Both the Sharks and the Barracuda held their 2025-26 training camps at Sharks Ice. The Barracuda opened their home season on October 11 at Tech CU Arena.
- Excite Ballpark Home of the San Jose Giants (Verbal). The Giants won the 2025 California League Title, their first since 2021. A complete reconstruction of the field begins in November. Work continues on the clubhouse and training facilities behind the left-field fence.

##### b. Accept Verbal Reports on Arena Authority Administrative Items.

- VTA/BART Downtown/Diridon Community Working Group. The CWG met in early October.
- South Campus Operations Team. Discussions with the City's Department of Transportation continues regarding the installation of a mid-block crosswalk along E. Alma Avenue by the ballpark and the ice center.

  - Nature for Us. Arena Authority staff is working on gaining a better understanding of the applicant. Due to timing, Board authorizes Arena Authority staff to determine if Nature for Us receives up to \$20,000 credit for their event on November 16. Approved with 7 approvals (Shikada no longer at meeting). 1<sup>st</sup>: Bojorquez, 2<sup>nd</sup>: Fetzer.
5. Open Forum/Public Comments. Board member, Cynthia Bojorquez, inquired about the Sharks public response in regards to the ICE controversy at the October 18 Sharks game. Kevin Ice responded that there were discussions and an explanation between City staff and SAP Center Management representatives who confirmed the issue was addressed and future messaging will be more rigorously reviewed. The Sharks have publicly apologized for the “offensively worded message”.

The Arena Authority is pleased to submit for your review the Authority's Arena Ticket Distribution Program Activity Report for Fiscal Year 2024-25. Under the terms of the Amended and Restated San Jose Arena Management Agreement between the City of San Jose and Sharks Sports & Entertainment, the City has retained the use of a luxury suite (known as the City suite, which includes 16 suite tickets) and when available sixteen (16) seats in the lower seating level (generally known as the Club level) for events at SAP Center at San Jose. The Arena Authority distributes these tickets through the guidelines established by San Jose City Council Policy 9-11, *Distribution of Tickets or Passes to City Officials*.

There are six categories in which complimentary tickets can be distributed through the City Council Policy. The six categories include: (1) ceremonial occasions; (2) official welcoming of visiting dignitaries; (3) economic development outreach; (4) recognition for direct involvement in City-related projects or programs; (5) attracting or rewarding volunteer public service; and (6) encouraging or rewarding significant academic, athletic, or public service achievements by City students, residents, or businesses.

For your reference, the attached annual ticket report provides a listing of each Center event; the responsible party; users of the City suite and Club seat tickets; the municipal purpose for each use; and the number of suite and Club seat tickets used or sold under the program.

During the year, 2881 tickets were provided to the Arena Authority. From this inventory, the Arena Authority distributed all the tickets per the guidelines of the City Council policy. During the year a high number of requests from City and community-based organizations were honored with many of the organizations recommended directly through the City Council offices. Since the ticket program was introduced in 1993, the Arena Authority has received and distributed over 134,000 tickets.
