## REASON FOR SUPPLEMENTAL

This Supplemental Memorandum makes a correction to the term of the Cooperation Agreement ("Agreement"), and provides additional information on the planned expenditures of Housing Authority Litigation Award ("HALA") funds.

## **ANALYSIS**

The submitted Memorandum for the City Council meeting on September 12, 2017, stated that "...there is no sunset to the Agreement." The correct statement is that the Agreement will have a term of 45 years.

Additionally, this Supplemental Memorandum provides additional information regarding current and potential uses of the HALA funds.

The submitted Memorandum notes that the City's FY 2017-2018 Adopted Operating Budget includes a \$4.0 million appropriation for the operation of the Homeless Rapid Rehousing program in 2017-2018, \$4.0 million set aside in a reserve for funding of the Homeless Rapid Rehousing program in 2018-2019, and \$300,000 for the Rock Springs Landlord Incentive program.

The use of HALA funds for specific affordable housing developments was delineated in the Housing Department's <u>Affordable Housing Investment Plan for FY 2016/17 – FY 2017/18</u> ("Investment Plan"). The City Council approved the Investment Plan on June 6, 2017. The HALA funds are a major component of the aggregate pool of funds for planned developments that the City Council will be asked to approve on an individual basis.

The following chart integrates the current uses of HALA funds with additional information on potential expenditures of the remaining HALA funds. The multifamily projects may be partially or fully funded by HALA. All project costs are estimates and are subject to change.
