Location: Washington, D.C.

Meeting Dates: October 18th-20th, 2023

Source of Funds: The Aspen Institute, 501c3 (airfare, lodging, meals, ground transportation)

Purpose: Bloomberg CityLab is an annual conference dedicated to bringing together global mayors, city innovators, business leaders, urban experts, and activists to uncover replicable solutions to pressing issues. Bloomberg has long been a pillar in the civic innovation community and supports the community through grantmaking, publicity, and media creation. CityLab has historically invited Mayor's and Chief Innovation Officers from San Jose to their annual meetings.

Stephen Caines is the Chief Innovation Officer and Budget Director for the Mayor's Office. He is a lawyer and published expert on the ethics and regulation of Surveillance AI. He will speak with other civic technology leaders, elected officials, and public servants throughout the conference. He will advance the development of San Jose's AI ecosystem by continuing to build public-private partnerships. Stephen will also participate in an invitation-only workshop for Chief Innovation Officers on October 18th. San Jose benefits from attending such conferences as it unlocks opportunities for fundraising, partnerships, and establishing best practices.
