RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a resolution approving the donation of eight City surplus vehicles with a cumulative value of \$42,500 to San José Police Historical Society, San José Fire Museum, Silicon Valley Career Technical Education, San Francisco Police Department, and the Spring Valley Volunteer Fire Department, including:

- a) Six Fire Apparatus, one 1986 Pierce Pumper, one 1988 Pierce Snorkel and four 1994 Spartan Pumpers with an estimated cumulative value of \$34,500; and
- b) One 2007 Harley Davidson Police Motorcycle with an estimated value of \$4,000; and
- c) One 2009 Chevrolet Traverse with an estimated value of \$4,000.

OUTCOME

The donation of surplus vehicles will preserve fire apparatus and police vehicle history used for the education and enjoyment of City of San José residents and visitors through museum exhibits and community outreach events. The utilization of surplus fire apparatus also provides critical resources for an educational institution and for a local volunteer fire department tasked with protecting life and property in the San José foothills. The undercover surplus police vehicle would be used in a Bay Area task force, which includes the San José Police Department, enforcing internet crimes against children.

BACKGROUND

The City's Fire and Police departments have identified the following fleet assets as surplus because of age, mileage, mechanical condition, and obsolescence:

San José Municipal Code Section 4.16.250, states that any surplus property valued in excess of \$1,500 may be donated by the City Council to a public or governmental body or agency, volunteer fire department, or a non-profit corporation. It further provides that all donations shall be made without warranty (express or implied) and requires the transferee to indemnify and hold the City harmless from claims arising out of the condition of the property or its use by the organization or subsequent transferee.

In 2008, the Council adopted Policy #1-20 "Donation of Surplus Personal Property" (Donation Policy). Pursuant to the Donation Policy, property worth more than \$1,500 may be donated with Council approval but no property valued in excess of \$10,000 may be donated.

The value of each of the assets described in the table above was determined by analyzing recent and past auction data from similar units sold, researching published market values where available, and outreaching with fleet dealerships for unique items such as the 1988 Pierce Snorkel. Based on this research, DPW staff has determined the unit value of each vehicle is below \$10,000, therefore they are eligible for donation pursuant to the San José Municipal Code and Donation Policy.

The City has occasionally received request for surplus vehicles over the years which have always been a small fraction of the total number of its surplus vehicles and typically for specialized surplus fleet assets in the Police and Fire departments. This group of vehicles targeted for donation are a result of interest expressed to City staff over the last few years from organizations with a need for the specific surplus vehicles being requested. The vast majority of surplus City vehicles are sold through third party auction services. Since adoption of Council Donation Policy in November 2008, the City has sold approximately 1,600 vehicles and equipment through the auction process producing sales revenue of more than \$2 million. In addition, since 2008 the City has donated 42 vehicles, 33 of which were for 2017 Flood Victims. The vehicle donation program has proven to be a benefit to the community for very selective needs that have outweighed the auctioned value.

ANALYSIS

On October 18, 2017, the Rules and Open Government Committee approved the notification process for the potential donation of eight surplus vehicles as required by the City's Donation Policy. On October 25, 2017, Public Works posted a "Notice of Intended Donation of Surplus Fleet Vehicles" on the City's website. The information and links to the City's website were also

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sent out directly to volunteer fire departments, relevant educational institutions, and non-profit historical societies as follows:

Five requests for the vehicles were received from San José Police Historical Society, San José Fire Museum, Silicon Valley Career Technical Education, San Francisco Police Department (SFPD), and the Spring Valley Volunteer Fire Department by the November 20, 2017, application deadline and are summarized below:

- The San José Police Historical Society requested the 2007 Harley Davidson Motorcycle and would display the motorcycle at the San José Police Sub-Station to honor motor officers in alignment with their goal of preserving and educating the public on the San José Police Department's history.
- The San José Fire Museum requested that (4) four fire vehicles be donated to the museum. The 1986 Pierce 1500 GPM Pumper Fire Engine would be painted pink and used to promote Breast Cancer Awareness. The 1988 Pierce Snorkel served active duty as Truck One in San José old Fire Station One and would be part of the Museum's truck history. The museum also requested two (2) of the Hi-Tech 1500 GPM Fire Engines which were the first San José fire engines with fully enclosed cabs which aligns with the Museum's goals of preserving the history of firefighting in San José and serving the community.
- Silicon Valley Career Technical Education located in San José requested the 1994 Spartan Pumper and the 2009 Chevrolet Traverse. The vehicles will be used for Fire Science and First Responder training of high school students.
- The SFPD requested the 2009 Chevrolet Traverse. The SFPD Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) unit is currently a member of the Silicon Valley ICAC Task Force managed

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by the San José Police Department. The agency task force has a shortage of these type of resources and the vehicle would be used for comprehensive under-cover criminal investigations pertaining to internet crimes against children.

• The Spring Valley Volunteer Fire Department requested the 1994 Spartan Pumper to be used to protect lives, property and the environment covering 250 square miles including parts of the East San José Foothills. Volunteer Fire departments often acquire and rely on retired frontline apparatus from larger agencies. Even though these units have served a full useful life in frontline capacity, they can be beneficial to a rural volunteer fire department with limited resources and much lower response needs.

All potential donees have complied with the appropriate verifications regarding status of a government, nonprofit agency, or volunteer fire department and have signed the Disclaimer and other Conditions of Donation documents. The completed applications from each organization are attached to this memorandum.

Section 2.a of the Donation Policy states that when evaluating requests for donations, "priority should be given to organizations on the basis of how likely the donation of surplus property will benefit City residents. In general, preference should be given to governmental agencies and volunteer fire departments over non-profit organizations." Pursuant to this direction, staff recommends donating to each of the requesting organizations because each requestor will have direct benefit to San José residents. These benefits are preserving and displaying San José public safety history, educating future first responders, protecting property, and preventing and investigating crimes against children. In one case, two organizations, San Francisco Police Department and Silicon Valley Career Technical Education requested the same vehicle, the 2009 Chevrolet Traverse undercover SUV. Staff recommends that the SUV be donated to the San Francisco Police Department because of the interagency Task Force with the San José Police Department.

EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

This memorandum will not require any follow-up from staff.

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POLICY ALTERNATIVES

Alternative #1: Sell the units through a competitive auction process.

Pros: Raise approximately \$42,500 of revenue for the City.

Cons:

Historical Societies: The unique attributes of vehicles requested such as the fire trucks and the police motorcycle are first of its kind and will not be preserved as part of the City's public safety historical collection.

Local Educational Programs: Fire Pumper trucks used in local fire science educational programs for training future fire fighters would be less effective because of the age of their current Fire Pumper trucks compared to the City's Fire Pumper truck.

Other Bay Area Agencies: SUV potentially used for undercover police operations reduces the interagency Task Force effectiveness.

Reason for Not Recommending: The benefits and value of donating the vehicles for various purposes helps support local organizations with limited resources and has greater value to City residents than the projected revenue.

This memorandum has been coordinated with the Fire and Police Departments, and the City Attorney's Office.



NOTICE OF INTENDED DONATION OF SURPLUS FLEET VEHICLES

1. DESCRIPTION OF SURPLUS ITEMS

The City has retired the following vehicles from the active San José fleet because of age, mileage, mechanical and operational obsolescence.

- Four 1994 Spartan Fire Apparatus, 1500gpm Pumper
- One 2007 Harley Davidson Police Motorcycle FLHTP

3. ELIGIBLE ORGANIZATIONS

Priority shall be given to organizations on the basis of how likely the donation of surplus property will benefit City residents with preference given to governmental agencies and volunteer fire departments over non-profit organizations. Organizations that are eligible donees are listed below:

- Government Agencies
- Volunteer Fire Departments
- Non-Profit Organizations that are so classified per Internal Revenue Code Section 501 (c) (3), and who also meet one of the following:
 - 1. Must currently provide a service that compliments or serves a common client base of an existing City program.
 - Must be able to utilize the donation to further a special project or geographically focused City effort or benefits a particular group such as the elderly, low income families, the homeless population, or any group or community the City wishes to provide assistance to.

4. HOW TO SUBMIT REQUEST FOR DONATION

Eligible organizations may request consideration for donation items by submitting the Donation Request Form attached. As a condition to final selection, organizations recommended for selection as donees will be required to sign the attached Disclaimer Form. Submission of the attached Disclaimer Form does not guarantee final selection; organizations which are finally selected as donees shall be notified in writing by the Director of Finance or designee.

The deadline to submit the Donation Request Form and Disclaimer Form (attached) is November 20, 2017 by 4:00 pm (Pacific Time) and must be submitted to the contact person listed above in Section 2.

The apparatus will be painted pink, detailed with high profile safety messages, and outfitted with breast cancer awareness materials for distribution. The intent is to make this Engine available for display at events and occasions such as parades, fund raisers, public education events and schools. SJFM staff will be positioned to provide information and answer questions regarding breast cancer awareness to the general public. The Engine will be available to attend events in the City of San Jose, and in cooperating cities/jurisdictions, and will proudly represent the San Jose Fire Department and demonstrate the Department and City's dedication to breast cancer awareness, prevention, and cure. The San Jose Fire Museum wishes to represent the San Jose Fire Department in the annual San Francisco Avon Walk for Breast Cancer, which is an internationally acclaimed event. Currently, San Jose Fire and San Jose Police dispatchers participate in this event annually.

BACKGROUND:

The San Jose Fire Museum (SJFM) was incorporated in 2002. The organization was originally created in the early 1970's and called the San Jose Muster Team. We have a Business Plan, Bylaws and a 501(c)3 non-profit status from the State of California. Our Mission is threefold:

- 1) Preserve the history of the San Jose Fire Department and the City of San Jose,
- 2) Serve the San Jose Fire Chief and the city and
- 3) Share this preserved collection with the residents of San Jose.

The San Jose Fire Department started in 1854 when the City of San Jose officially recognized Hook & Ladder No. One (Today it is called Aerial Ladder Truck Co. Background: The Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force Program (ICAC) is a national network of 61 coordinated task forces representing more than 4,500 federal, state, and local law enforcement and prosecutorial agencies. These agencies are engaged in both proactive and reactive investigations, forensic examinations, and criminal prosecutions. By helping state and local agencies develop effective, sustainable responses to online child victimization — including responses to child sexual abuse images, the ICAC Program has increased law enforcements capacity to combat technology facilitated crimes against children at every level.

The ICAC Program was developed in response to the increasing number of children and teenagers using the Internet and other technology, the proliferation of child sexual abuse images available electronically, and the heightened online activity by predators seeking unsupervised contact with potential underage victims. During the course of our duties, the vehicle will be utilized to conduct follow up and comprehensive under-cover criminal investigations pertaining directly to child sexual exploitation. SFPD ICAC has continued to meet and succeed all MOU requirements within the task force.

The City of San Francisco Police Department has a budget deficit which will not allow our agency to purchase new and/or used undercover vehicles. We are currently a team of 4 sharing one Ford Crown Victoria sedan. This particular vehicle is not practical for our day to day operations.
