## SUPPLEMENTAL

**SUBJECT: APPOINTMENT TO THE BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION FOR THE  
FEDERATED RETIREMENT PLAN AND TO THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION**

### **REASON FOR SUPPLEMENTAL**

This supplemental memo provides information concerning the election results for the appointment of the Employee Member to the Board of Administration for Federated City Employees Retirement System and the Employee Nominated Member to the Civil Service Commission.

### **Recommendation:**

- (a) Appoint Brian Chi as the employee representative to the Board of Administration for the Federated Retirement Plan to a term from December 1, 2025 to November 30, 2029; and
- (b) Appoint Gary DiQuisto Employee nominated public member to the Civil Service Commission to a term from December 1, 2025 to November 30, 2029.

### **UPDATE**

#### **A. Board of Administration for the Federated Plan**

San Jose Municipal Code Section 2.08.1010 requires that two of the seven members of the Board of Administration for the Federated Plan be employees who are also members of the Plan. One of the employee member seats on the Board is currently vacant. Pursuant to San Jose Municipal Code Section 2.08.1070(A), whenever a vacancy exists in a seat on the Board held by a City employee, the City employees who are members of the Federated City Employees' Retirement System shall recommend, at an election to be conducted among them by the City Clerk, one of such employees as a successor for such seat; provided, however, upon any vacancy or vacancies in such office during the unexpired regular term, the City Council shall, in accordance with rules prepared by the City Clerk and approved by the City Council, appoint to such vacant seat for the

remainder of the unexpired term, a City employee who is also a member of the Federated City Employees' Retirement System. Further, the appointment of employee member is routine business on the Council agenda and may be an item on the consent calendar. Council may only reject the employee recommended by a majority of those voting in an election among employees, held in accordance with Section 2.08.1070(A), upon a finding of cause for rejection. Cause for rejection may include, but is not limited to, Council finding that the recommended candidate will not be able to attend meetings of the Board and fulfill the time commitment of a member of the Board, or to act in accordance with fiduciary duties or carry out the requirements of governing legislation, including the requirements of the Federated Employees Retirement Plan as set forth in the San Jose Municipal Code.

For the election, the City Clerk's office distributed 4,241 ballots to eligible members of the Federated Retirement System. During the voting period, 219 ballots were returned, and on November 17, 2025 at 2:00 p.m. at the City Clerk's Office, the ballots were opened and counted. The election results are:

**B. Civil Service Commission**

The membership of the Civil Service Commission is established in the City Charter Section 1001, with additional information in the San Jose Municipal Code Sections 2.08.2000, et seq. The Civil Service Commission consists of five (5) members who must be residents in the City of San José are appointed by the City Council. The Employee Nominated Public Member must be nominated by all full-time officers and employees in the Civil Service of the City, other than members of the Council and members of Boards and Commissions. Under Section 1001(b) of the City Charter, the Office of the City Clerk conducts an employee nomination election to refer the names of the three persons receiving the highest number of votes to the City Council. Gary DiQuisto was first appointed in 2023 to fill the unexpired term caused by the death of the previous employee nominated public member, William Brill.

For the election, the City Clerk's office distributed 5,905 ballots to eligible members of the civil service. During the voting period, 219 ballots were returned, and on November 17, 2025 at 2:00 p.m. at the City Clerk's Office, the ballots were opened and counted. The election results are:


