- b. Until Connection Partners secures the new funding, no additional city funds, staff time, or resources shall be allocated for the completion of Phase 2a beyond that which is covered by previously allocated funding.
 - c. To ensure the future success of San Jose Mineta Airport (SJC), Phase 2a shall include analysis and recommendations that create the necessary flexibility for future airport growth.
 - d. In parallel with or as part of Phase 2a, work with Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) as the lead agency to evaluate the various emerging technology options that could offer alternatives to this Connector. No General Fund dollars shall be used for this evaluation.
2. Reject staff recommendation (b). Given San Jose's priority of completing BART Silicon Valley Phase II (BSVII) and preserving bus service for all residents, the City should not seek additional VTA funds for the Connector project until these two priorities are ensured, and surplus VTA funds for the Connector are identified. (11-0-0)
