SUBJECT: ACTIONS RELATED TO PURCHASE ORDERS FOR MONITORING, INSPECTION, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR SERVICES FOR FIRE AND BURGLAR ALARM SYSTEMS

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager to negotiate and execute purchase orders with Security Alert Systems of California, Inc. (Gilroy, CA) for monitoring, inspection, maintenance and repair services for fire and burglar alarm systems, to extend services for up to two (2) additional one-year option terms for a total of three (3) options through August 13, 2023 under the same material terms and conditions for a not-to-exceed amount of \$900,000 through August 13, 2022, subject to the appropriation of funds.

Desired Outcome: To ensure the City's fire and burglar alarm systems are safe, functioning in optimal condition and preserved.

BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION:

The Department of Public Works (PW) Facilities Management Division is responsible for overseeing the maintenance of fire and burglar alarm systems and security camera maintenance at over 300 City facilities. The systems are located at police facilities, fire stations, community centers, libraries, parks, and corporate yards, Happy Hollow Park and Zoo, and other City locations. The primary components of these systems that need to be maintained are panels, devices, access controls/keypads, and cameras.

Security Alert Systems of California, Inc. (Security Alert) was awarded a purchase order (PO) for these services as a result of a competitive Request for Proposal (RFP) that closed on June 7, 2019 and was approved by City Council on August 13, 2019.¹ The PO expires on August 13, 2021.

Staff plans to conduct two separate solicitations to replace the current services. The first solicitation will be a Request for Bid (RFB) for monitoring, inspection, testing, maintenance and repair services for burglar and fire systems; and the second will be a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the purchase and maintenance of security cameras and a video management system including video retention and cloud storage. Splitting these services into two solicitations is expected to increase competition during the bid process and will allow the City to procure a comprehensive enterprise video management system.

Approval of this recommendation will ensure continuity of services until staff can complete the bid and award these two solicitations. Security Alert may request an equitable price adjustment prior to the exercise of each option consistent with the applicable, living/prevailing wage increases, and/or applicable industry indices.
