

Climate Smart Decarbonization & Mitigation

The Climate Smart plan guides San José's efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions across the City.

- This past quarter, the team has completed the draft of the updated Climate Smart document, graphics and layout.
- Stakeholder engagement for the Climate Smart plan update was projected to be completed in Q3, but has not yet started and is expected to begin in May 2025 following the release of the public draft.
- The draft of the City Council memorandum is also delayed, with the Council date now pushed to Fall 2025 to accommodate extensive input from City departments.
- T&E update tentatively scheduled for October 2025.



Partnering with PG&E:

In partnership with PG&E, the City is advancing initiatives to support electrification, streamline permitting, and enhance energy infrastructure.

- A Cooperation Agreement was brought to Council on March 4, and the basis for an Implementation Agreement for North San José (NSJ) and Downtown San José (DTSJ) was presented at the Special Council Meeting on March 21.
- The City and PG&E are actively negotiating the Implementation Agreement with a goal to execute before the end of June.
- Efforts to explore San José zonal electrification opportunities, including identifying potential SB1221 pilot sites, were completed.
- Additionally, the Partnership Pilot for programmatic permit expansion and the development of a shared dashboard has been implemented.




Ensuring Clean Creeks and Rivers (Stormwater Permit):

The City holds a stormwater permit to ensure compliance with state and federal Clean Water Act regulations aimed at protecting water quality and maintaining stormsewer system and healthy clean creeks and rivers.

In alignment with these requirements, the City provided a six-month Direct Discharge progress update to the Water Board in January 2025, which has been completed and approved.

Additionally, the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with Valley Water for in-channel creek clean-up efforts is being finalized, supporting ongoing efforts to reduce pollution and improve local waterways.
