

I bring over six years of professional experience in climate, energy, and transportation policy, as well as an academic background in public policy and governance, which together qualify me for this appointment. As Policy Director for Climate and Energy at the Bay Area Council, I work directly with business leaders and policymakers to advance sustainable and affordable energy solutions, including working with airlines and airports. My prior role as Policy Advisor to the Mayor of San José honed my expertise in analyzing and advancing complex transportation and environmental initiatives in collaboration with regional, state, and federal partners. In addition, I have experience in academic and international policy research, including work with the University of Chicago's Policy Lab on equitable education funding and with the World Resources Institute in Brazil on implementing the Paris Climate Agreement. I hold a Master of Public Policy from the University of Chicago and a B.A. in Political Science from UC Berkeley, with a focus on quantitative methods and environmental policy.

What is your understanding of the purpose of the Commission?

The purpose of the commission is to provide recommendations on policy proposals to committees and the City Council so that they can make more informed decisions and so that City Staff can flesh out more information on each topic before it appears before the Council.

Please list three issues facing the City that you feel the Council should address.

-The ongoing housing and homelessness crisis in San Jose and California is the number one priority of the City Council. Tackling this problem requires faster building of housing and finding quick, affordable housing solutions for the unhoused. - San Jose faces ongoing concerns about public safety, which threatens business development and urban vibrancy. The City has struggled to get staffing for public safety to the necessary levels due to systemic budget deficits. These issues will need to be fixed to improve San Jose's sustained economic improvement. - Lastly, major public transportation projects like BART to San Jose and California High Speed Rail continue to face fiscal challenges to their project success. If completed, these projects could provide huge benefit to the City, but maintaining public support in the wake of cost overruns has proven difficult.

What are the three most critical challenges facing Mineta San Jose International Airport in the next five years? What do you bring to the table in terms of experience, expertise, or perspective to help address these challenges

San Jose Airport's three biggest challenges are: - Recovering from a post-COVID travel environment and adjusting to the new normal for business travel, with a smaller percentage of trips taken. - Dealing with competition from other regional airports such as SFO and OAK. - Addressing environmental impacts to the surrounding community, such as airport noise and particulate matter emissions. I have experience working as a public policy professional who has convened and listened to stakeholders to build consensus around solutions to big public policy issues. With a background of working in government and working with private sector partners, I believe that I am well-positioned to understand how to balance the needs of the airport and the surrounding community.

San José Mineta International Airport has a dual responsibility. To serve as a world-class gateway for Silicon Valley and to minimize its impacts on surrounding neighborhoods. Balancing these roles requires strategies that strengthen the airport's competitiveness while respecting community concerns about noise, traffic, and environmental impacts. To tackle these issues, I would approach each conflict with a perspective of trying to answer the question, "How do we make sure that the things which benefit the airport, benefit the surrounding community as well, and vice versa?"



The airport must be responsive to the airlines and travelers and to the surrounding communities that feel the impacts of its operations. Transparent and honest communication that starts early and ongoing is important. Decisions around issues such as noise, traffic, etc. should be data-driven but which allow for community feedback. When conflicts arise — such as expanding air traffic versus limiting noise — the airport should strive for collaboration. With my experience leading community organizations and advising clients on complex legal issues, I am comfortable navigating tensions between conflicting goals and working towards a resolution.

To that end, the City and Airport should: Engage directly with leaders in tech, biotech, finance, and real estate development business leaders to gather data on travel needs and build support for new international and business-class routes; Partner with groups such as Silicon Valley Leadership Group, chambers of commerce, and regional organizations to support these efforts; Highlight the economic and social value of a well-connected airport to the community; Personally, I can help achieve this goal in several ways: As managing partner of a law firm serving high-net-worth professionals, business owners, and international clients, I can help to connect the Airport to community leaders who are invested in reliable, premium air service. Through my work on neighborhood and civil groups, I can serve as a bridge between the Airport's growth and community concerns.



Community Engagement and Inclusion: Promoting participation in city programs and decision-making among diverse populations, including people with disabilities, helps ensure policies and initiatives reflect the needs and values of all residents.

In the past year, I have participated in a variety of arts activities in San José that reflect my passion for exposing my children to the richness of our city's cultural offerings. I attended Macario at the Mexican Heritage Plaza to share with my children the depth of Mexican culture and storytelling. We have visited the Tech Museum multiple times, drawn by its creative and interactive exhibits that combine innovation and art. At the San José Museum of Art, we experienced the Alebrijes exhibit, which allowed us to explore vibrant cultural traditions and artistic expression. I also attended a performance at the San José Center for the Performing Arts to support my daughter in her Polynesian dance performance, which highlighted the importance of community and cultural pride. 





I served as a commissioner when the Commission was named the San Jose Clean Energy Advisory Commission. Chair and Member of the Board for Climate Reality: Silicon Valley from June 2018 through December 2022. Recently served on the Santa Clara County Housing Authority, Avenida Espana HDC Board as Board Secretary from early 2020 through August of 2022. The board's focus is to review the operations of the housing projects it oversees and to accept the financial reporting, both audits and tax returns for each project. As board members we can question and ask for clarification regarding all aspects of all projects operations. I reviewed and commented on the operation of 9 distinct housing projects. On the Board of Directors for the League of Women Voters San Jose/Santa Clara and in that capacity served as Development Director. This provides me insights about our purpose including, but not limited to: • Providing thoughtful and studied review and comment regarding the wide range of the San Jose's climate plans, actions and functions to both reduce emissions in the City and to expand our renewable clean energy. • Providing insights and comment regarding ways to accelerate our work to meet San Jose's carbon neutral 2030 goals. • Monitoring and evaluating municipal, regional and state climate policy and legislation to communicate approval or concern regarding the effectiveness of that policy and legislation. • Acting as a bridge of communication between the community, climate and energy non-profit organizations to support a free flow of input in both directions between San Jose departments and offices and the greater community. • Support to staff's community outreach to encourage greater community participation in the City's climate and energy programs, including but not limited to: o TRANSPORTATION: switching from gas based vehicles to EV purchases, increasing bike lanes and walking opportunities, promoting multifamily construction close to transit, and other transportation modifications. o BUILDING ELECTIFICATION: homes, multi-family residences, commercial and industrial properties. Use of expanded cool roof beyond current California code for residential, commercial and industrial roof new construction and re-roofing. o GREENING of our spaces that provide added cooling impacts. o CODES: improved building codes, and clearer communication with contractors and the public that help increase the use of heat pumps and other construction tools to support our climate and renewable energy work. The Commission communicates with City staff including the Mayor's office, via the Transportation and Environment Committee and directly to these departments to share our support for City Climate plans, policy and action AND to express concerns for plans and policy. The Commission's advice and comment also extends to comment on climate challenges that arise from the local, regional, state and Federal economic, social and regulatory environment. Key City climate and energy functions the Commission focuses its review and comment on include: * The Climate Advisory Commission makes direct recommendations, regarding a wide array of City relevant climate issues, to the City Council via T&E and staff after review, discussion and majority Commission approval. * The Commission monitors and works with Climate Smart that staffs the Commissions management. Their work includes actions related to community outreach for the myriad programs we have in place, rebates, use of awarded grants and plans to pursue specific grants. They review and have comprehensive oversight of climate related City actions, plans, actions and goal monitoring. * monitoring San Jose climate related plans, policy, programs and actions both under the Climate Smart umbrella and SICE.

Please list three issues facing the City that you feel the Council should address.

Three San Jose issues the City Council should address that the Climate Advisory Commission can work on to recommend relate to accelerating GHG emission reduction in our community and, given SICE's mission, should focus on those specific issues most alleviated by the expansion of renewable and clean energy for the community. ISSUE 1: Transportation remains the greatest contributor to emissions. The City needs to continue influencing the shift to electric vehicle transportation. We already provide EV rebates and as possible SJCE should expand the program to accelerate EV adoption. As part of the EV adoption actions SICE is and should continue to expand convenient access to EV charging at single family households, multi-family complexes and other public locations via educating the public about incentives, low financing costs and system discounts. Hopefully as SICE has more discretionary funds, it will also be able to provide rebates and other financial encouragement to install EV charging, especially level 2 and 3 stations. And as part of this SICE can expand support for vehicle-grid integration with smart-charging and bidirectional charging technology. ISSUE 2: More rapid transition to all-electric infrastructure. This includes households (home and multi-family), commercial, institutional, industrial and government. It requires education about the value of all-electric (emphasizing heat pump technology for hot water, heating and air conditioning HVAC and induction stoves) and the means for residents to financially make the shift which is based on rebates and lower cost funding mechanisms that are tailored to the needs of that sector, whether household, business or organization. Providing expanded rebates for heat pump technology helps encourage people to go allelectric. Heat pump technology will continue to expand as both residents and contractor/installers are made aware of the benefits and have the capability to select the right heat pump technology with installation know-how. The removal of gas stoves with induction stove preferred (induction preferred) or electric stoves is a must not only for climate supportive emission reduction but also as a health hand safety measure. We can continue out efforts at community education about the value of electrification and the existence of rebates across local and state governments and also enlarge the rebate programs in San Iose, ISSUE 3: Assuring City Requirements and Programs emphasize multifamily development within walking distance from transit hubs. More focus on incentivizing multi-family development near transit hubs to encourage the use of public transportation would be a significant factor in reducing emissions. These transit-oriented communities would include denser mixed-use housing with retail to support resident's interest in locating in these areas. Suitable walking distance is generally considered around a half mile. It's value is multi-fold. • The increased public transit use would reduce emissions by reducing dependence on cars. • Supports a more extensive and better transit system that would benefit all residents that prefer to use transit. • Encourages more walking which is part of a healthier lifestyle. • Creates more opportunities for successful lower-income affordable housing.

Before that, I worked boots on the ground as a case manager in homeless outreach and in San Jose shelters. These roles have given me deep experience in program design, public sector innovation, funding strategy, and cross-sector collaboration. I hold a B.S. in Symbolic Systems from Stanford University, and I am currently pursuing a certificate in Affordable Housing and Community Development Finance at San Jose State University. This program is equipping me with technical skills in affordable housing finance and policy, while also grounding me in San Jose's local housing landscape. Beyond my professional and educational background, I serve on the Board of Directors for a recovery services nonprofit, where I contribute to governance, strategic planning, and community engagement. Through these experiences, I have built strong abilities in financial oversight, and consensus-building, which are skills that are essential for an effective commissioner. I also bring the personal perspective of a long-time renter in the Bay Area, with firsthand experience of the challenges of housing affordability. My understanding is that the Housing and Community Development Commission (HCDC) serves as an advisory body to the City Council and Department of Housing on housing policy and community development. HCDC evaluates existing housing programs and policies, reviews new policy proposals, and tracks the City's progress toward its housing goals. Homelessness: San Jose must continue to expand both interim and permanent housing options for people experiencing homelessness. Interim solutions should be dignified and service-oriented, rather than temporary shelters of last resort. Having worked in homeless services, including shelters in San Jose, I have seen firsthand the gaps in our system and the difference that well-designed, well-staffed facilities can make in helping people exit homelessness. The City should also focus on prevention by addressing inflow, while continuing to explore innovative solutions such as RV buyback programs and strengthening coordination with county and state partners on funding opportunities. Housing: Most of San Jose is zoned for single-family housing, which limits the City's ability to meet housing demand and perpetuates affordability challenges. Upzoning to allow opportunity housing would help diversify housing choices and create more pathways to affordability. At the same time, San lose should prioritize housing production downtown and along transit corridors, ensuring that growth benefits residents across income levels while also supporting the City's long-term economic vitality. Increasing Community Safety: Public safety goes beyond policing and includes strong crisis response and mental health services. Programs like San Jose's TRUST (Trusted Response Urgent Support Team) are vital for responding to mental health crises with care, dignity, and cultural competence. Expanding investments in programs like TRUST, alongside broader crime prevention initiatives, would strengthen community safety while reducing strain on emergency services. With my background in homelessness and crisis response, I have seen how integrating public health and public safety approaches can make neighborhoods safer.

These issues aren't isolated to San Jose, but something that many large cities across the U.S are facing. 1. Stock of Affordable Housing: Limited affordable housing supply drives up prices. The commission's work to support policies that increase the availability of affordable housing could include upstream related actions such as: fostering new developments, or other actions such as: offering incentives for affordable units, and ensuring that low- and middleincome residents have access to adequate housing. In my work with SNAP and the National School Lunch Program, threshold limit really hurt families that are middle income who are between the different eligibility levels. This is where the strategic and effective use of CDBG comes in. 2. Homelessness: This is a challenge that is not isolated to San Jose, Living in Washington D.C., I've seen how the city struggles to address this, with policies that would move encampments or breakdown encampments every couple month rather than addressing the root causes. The commission could continue to explore how services for the homeless, such as permanent supportive housing, shelters, and mental health resources, as well as working on prevention strategies to stop people from becoming homeless in the first place. 3. Tenant Protections: The commission could work on strengthening tenant protections, implementing rent control measures, and ensuring enforcement of building codes to protect renters from unsafe living environments. I think the policies are in place, but more efforts to communicate them would be beneficial.



Although I may not have experience serving on a city commission or board, I have experience being a staff member in UCLA's Undergraduate Students Association Council's Academic Affairs Commission, where I would attend quarterly meetings to discuss opportunities to support students in matters related to their academics. I collaborated with committee members to run the program "Books for Bruins," which provides financial assistance to afford college textbooks. We also discussed opportunities to cross-collaborate with multicultural organizations to raise awareness about this program. In addition, we conversed about issues students were facing and possible recommendations to report to the Academic Affairs Commissioner. I also joined two leadership development programs to best prepare myself to be part of a commission or board. I participated in SV@Home Action Fund's Civic Leadership Program, where we learned how to serve on locally appointed boards and commissions. Furthermore, I completed the Latino Board Leadership Academy, which trains and guides Latinos to serve on local boards, where I learned about board responsibilities, financial responsibilities, and the role of maintaining organizational sustainability.

Being part of this committee equipped me with the transferable skills that I can use as a commissioner, as I have an understanding of budget reviews, evaluating services and making recommendations with fellow members. - Further, being part of LEAF's Advocacy Program, I learned to be a better advocate for students and my community in spaces of influence, which provided me with the fundamental tools and knowledge regarding local government and state government making process in education. I also got to learn how to engage with local officials such as school board members, trustees, and county board members. Through the program, I engaged in difficult conversations and listened to the educational concerns from families and students. - Additionally, as a CLCAF Fellow with NextGen Policy, I gained an understanding of the legislative process, especially passing educational bills in the State Capitol. I was able to support research and see the importance of coalition efforts. This knowledge will be helpful as a commissioner because policy impacts the services of the libraries. - I also was part of LCSV's Policy, Advocacy, Leadership in Action Program (PALA) and Engaged Latina Leadership Activist (ELLA) program, where I got to further understand the different levels of government and the role commissions play as well as how to participate in civic boards and commissions. - I have a background in education issues as a College & Career Specialist in East San Jose and through lived experience. I work directly with students in middle school and high school to provide supplemental educational services to promote a college and career readiness culture in order to lessen the academic gaps students face. As a first-generation Latina, I have firsthand experience with the education inequalities that our historically marginalized communities face. This reality influenced my strong passion for tackling educational inequality issues starting in grades K-12 and then following higher education. As a result, I decided to pursue my higher education studies in addressing educational needs. My undergraduate studies in Sociology analyzed the educational inequities in urban education through a sociological perspective. I completed interdisciplinary coursework through my minor in Community Engagement & Social Change, where I learned about innovative solutions from community-based organizations with school leaders to address education issues such as literacy and math achievements in grades K-12, which have been exacerbated due to the pandemic. - Finally, I chaired UCLA's BruinHope, which promotes equitable education and wellness resources for orphanages in Tijuana for children that range from toddlers to teenagers. We provided STEM and literacy activities to children who were attending under-resourced schools. One of the reasons that made me passionate about giving back to children was that research was showing that third-grade literacy is an indicator of a student's success. Through this position, I learned program evaluation to improve programming and secure funding. Lastly, I was overseeing budgets, as the organization had to apply for grants and yearly funding through UCLA's administration. If I become commissioner, I will be able to transfer these skills and a diverse work background.

The City is facing housing unaffordability, which is impacting many families, forcing them to move out of the city. As a result, many schools have been closing because of the low enrollment they are facing as families move away from San Jose. This is an important issue as students moving around may impact students' academics. Another issue is homelessness, which has been slightly decreasing with new housing initiatives, but it is also a result of housing unaffordability and the rising cost of living. It is important to continue to provide wrap-around services to unhoused individuals and safer housing alternatives, as present initiatives such as tiny homes and mental health services. The third issue the City Council should address is our community safety, especially in our neighborhoods. Our city should be a place where our students and families feel safe, no matter where they live. Our Council has already begun focusing on this through their city-wide plan, especially as major events will be approaching next year, which is a big win for our communities. They are also utilizing advanced technology and working to ensure building community trust with our police department.

Growing up in San Jose, I was faced with early education issues as an English learner at a young age, which made it difficult to navigate the educational system, but influenced my strong passion for tackling educational inequality starting in K-12 public schools. Raised in an under-resourced neighborhood, I faced English Learning difficulties, education funding inequity, and financial hardships in a single-mother household. At the age of eight, I was working alongside my mother in the flea market. During this time, it was challenging as I had to learn English quickly to translate for my Spanish-speaking mother. I had to easily adapt and find services such as my local public library for help. I remember going to Joyce Ellington Branch Library whenever there was free time to get books to read and attend their library events like their story times, as an elementary student, to further my English language, Fast forward to the age of fourteen, my family was experiencing severe financial hardships and housing instability, which led me to rely on my local public library for computer and internet access, as well as a place to do homework during my high school years. I saw how instrumental the library was to me and many students. Thus, I volunteered for TeenReach, specifically in math tutoring, volunteering in Friends of the Library, and Summer Learning at East San Jose Carnegie Library. The library also became a space to finish some of my remote studies during undergrad. The San Jose Public Library played a pivotal role in my passion for education equity work and my community involvement, including my current occupation, which drives me to this commission to keep expanding access to families, students, and community members.



The Parks and Recreation Commission advises the City Council on the City's system of parks, playgrounds, recreation centers and facilities, and recreation programs, including community sports, plays, celebrations and other recreation activities.

Please list three issues facing the City that you feel the Council should address.

Given the scale of San José's \$554 million parks maintenance backlog and the staffing reductions despite a 22% increase in parkland over two decades, I believe the City Council should support a ballot measure to raise dedicated funding for capital improvements. At the same time, they should explore reallocating resources within the city budget to hire more parks maintenance staff. If vacancies exist, the city should consider adapting successful recruitment strategies used for police staffing especially those that have proven popular and effective. With development impact fees being waived and threatened by pending legislation, proactive investment is essential to preserve and expand equitable access to quality public spaces. The Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services Department plays a central role in the City's 311 response efforts through the BeautifySJ program, especially in addressing illegal dumping and blight. District 3 consistently has the highest number of 311 cleanup requests for illegal dumping, yet one of the lowest rates of junk pickup requests, suggesting a gap in awareness or access. The City should explore targeted outreach and advertising of the 311 app in this district to help close that gap, aligning with the goals of the City's Equity Atlas. In addition, the City should prioritize tree planting in neighborhoods with low canopy coverage, particularly in heat-vulnerable and underserved areas. This not only addresses long-standing inequities in green infrastructure but also supports San José's Climate Smart goals by improving air quality, reducing urban heat, and enhancing community resilience. More broadly, reducing blight and expanding the urban forest in parks and neighborhoods should remain a top priority to improve quality of life and foster environmental justice. Finally, the City must recognize the vital role the Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services Department can play in addressing the growing loneliness epidemic, as highlighted by former U.S. Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy. While seniors are especially vulnerable, social isolation affects residents of all ages. San José's extensive park system is a tremendous public asset, one that can foster connection, community, and mental wellbeing when properly supported. The City should invest in this department not only to maintain and improve park infrastructure, but also to ensure it has the staffing and resources to activate these spaces, pursue grant opportunities, and create inclusive programming that brings people together. In doing so, the City will not only enhance quality of life but also advance public health and equity across neighborhoods.

Over the past decade, I've built a strong foundation working within and alongside various governmental agencies. As a local government employee for over 10 years, I've collaborated across departments and with external agencies on a range of initiatives, including grantfunded projects. My work has involved coordination with organizations such as the Valley Transportation Authority (VTA), FEMA, the State of California, and multiple city governments; each requiring a nuanced understanding of interagency processes and priorities. Beyond my professional role, I've actively contributed to civic engagement and transportation advocacy. I served on the San Jose Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee, where I worked closely with the city's Department of Transportation to advance infrastructure improvements and promote multimodal mobility. Additionally, as a member of the Silicon Valley Bicycle Coalition, I advocate for safer streets and equitable access for all road users, often engaging with local and regional agencies to support policy and planning efforts. This blend of direct government service, interagency collaboration, and community advocacy has given me a comprehensive perspective on how public agencies operate and how to effectively drive change within them.

As a Parks and Recreation Commissioner, how would you handle a situation where you have a volatile Community group which is opposed to a staff proposal?

As a commissioner in an advisory role, it's important for me to be a bridge between the community and the city organization. I would ensure that I listen, that there is transparency in the process, and that the dialogue is constructive. I would try to understand where the group and neighbors are coming from through conversation. This is important to let them know they're heard, and that their perspective is valid. I would make sure that all parties understand the details of a proposal. As a seasoned local government employee, I could use my knowledge to help clear up any misunderstandings and try to modify any proposals as necessary. I would advise the City Council to hear both the technical aspects of the proposal, and also the feelings from residents. I'd use my judgement to land at a proposal that factors in both staff and the residents' ideas, to the extent that the solution is feasible. This could also manifest through pilot programs or phasing projects. Ultimately, it would be important to hear all sides and come to a workable solution.

Can you provide examples of major public policy issues that you have been involved in and what your role was in the issue?

One major public policy issue I've been deeply involved in is San Jose's Vision Zero initiative, which aims to eliminate traffic fatalities and serious injuries. Despite the city adopting this goal in 2015, progress has been slow, and traffic deaths have reached record highs in recent years. As an advocate and member of both the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) and the Silicon Valley Bicycle Coalition, I've worked to hold the city accountable to its own Vision Zero and Better Bikeways plans, especially during street resurfacing and infrastructure projects where safety upgrades are often overlooked. My role has been to elevate community concerns, push for evidence-based street treatments, and organize a unified voice for safer mobility. A specific example I'm proud of is my involvement in the Quimby Road resurfacing project. Initially, the city's plans did not include any significant improvements to bicycle infrastructure, even though the Better Bikeways plan called for Class IV protected bike lanes. Quimby Road is a critical corridor that serves both a middle school and a high school, making safe access essential. Upon learning about the project, I quickly mobilized the BPAC and worked with city staff to advocate for changes. Within two months, we successfully influenced the redesign to include Class IV lanes, resulting in a safer, more inclusive street for all users. This experience reinforced the importance of persistent, informed advocacy in shaping public policy and ensuring that city plans translate into meaningful action.


