<u>SUBJECT</u>: File No. ST25-002 – Street Renaming of Street Segments West St. John Street, North Almaden Boulevard, and Santa Teresa Street, to "Sharks Way"

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

- 1. Direct staff to initiate the process to rename the segment of N. Almaden Boulevard, between W. Julian Street and the current W. St. John Street to "Little Italy Way."
- 2. Approve staff's recommendation to rename W. St. John Street to "Sharks Way," contingent upon the renaming of N. Almaden Boulevard to "Little Italy Way."

## **BACKGROUND**

We fully support renaming segments of W. St. John Street, N. Almaden Boulevard, and Santa Teresa Street to "Sharks Way" to create a unified corridor that links San Pedro Square to the SAP Center through Little Italy. This effort strengthens the connection of three iconic destinations in our city and celebrates the San Jose Sharks, a beloved civic institution. At the same time, we recognize the cultural and historical importance of the Little Italy district, which the community has actively revitalized and serves as a premiere gateway into the west side of downtown.

To enhance a clear, cohesive identity across these three distinct and adjacent neighborhoods, we recommend first renaming N. Almaden Boulevard between W. Julian Street and the current W. St. John Street to "Little Italy Way" before proceeding with the Sharks Way designation. This
