Guadalupe Emergency Interim Housing (EIH)

- 76 units/beds
- \$13.7 Million Site Delivery (\$180k per unit)
- 18 Month Design to Completion Schedule
- Interim use

SureStay Hotel (HomeKey)

- 76 units
- \$14.1 Million Acquisition
- \$3 Million Minor Rehabilitation (est.)
- Interim use with option to convert to Permanent
