**A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE, SUBJECT TO THE APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS BY THE CITY COUNCIL, AND ON SUCH TERMS AND CONDITIONS AS DEEMED APPROPRIATE BY THE CITY MANAGER, AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PARKS, RECREATION, AND NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT FUNDS, NEGOTIATE, AND EXECUTE FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026 AGREEMENTS AND AMENDMENTS AS IDENTIFIED IN "DELEGATION OF CONTRACT AUTHORITY TO DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, RECREATION, AND NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES DIRECTOR OR DESIGNEE" CONSISTENT WITH ADOPTED BUDGET AMOUNTS FOR VARIOUS CITY PROGRAMS AND/OR SERVICES**

**WHEREAS**, the City of San José ("City") contracts with community-based organizations, school districts, and other agencies to assist with various programs that support the livability of neighborhoods, offer opportunities for individuals to enjoy life, and cultivate healthy communities through quality programs and dynamic public spaces; and

**WHEREAS**, in response to the City Council's request to streamline the City's administrative process of doing business, including contract development, the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Neighborhood Services seeks authorization to apply for, accept funds, negotiate, and execute agreements for the following City programs and/or services, and identified in the Delegation of Contract Authority to the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Neighborhood Services Director or Designee shown in Attachment A:
