San Jose's Climate Leadership

- Climate Smart San José plan approved in 2018
 - Aligned with 2016 Paris Climate Agreement
 - Focused on climate action in energy, water, and mobility
- In November 2021, City Council adopted an aspirational goal of carbon neutrality by 2030
 - Return to Council for consideration in Q2 of 2022
- Since 2019, work significantly supported by American Cities Climate Challenge
 - Concluding in June 2022

- Also applied for \$1,673,000 in external funding (\$1,373,000 in this reporting period)
- Awards and Recognition
 - One of only 95 global cities on CDP's "A List"
 - Ranked 9th out of 100 cities on ACEEE's 2021 City Clean Energy Scorecard





Community Outreach and Engagement

- GoGreen Teams
 - Signed up 40+ Team Leaders
 - Host nine team meetings about food and waste, home energy, transportation, water, climate resilience, and disaster preparedness
 - First cohort will conclude in July 2022
- 3rd Annual Climate Smart Champion Awards
 - Recognizes 2021 outstanding climate efforts
 - April 19 City Council recognition and celebration

Climate Smart Pillar 1: A Sustainable & Climate Smart City Programs and Policies

- For 2022, SJCE's default GreenSource service is 60% renewable and 95% carbon-free
- New renewable energy projects
 - Online: 225 MW wind, 118 MW of solar with 68 MW of battery storage.
 - By end of 2022: 200 MW of solar with 10 MW battery storage
- Expect to launch EE programs in Spring 2022
- SolarAccess program
 - Offers low-income customers a 20% bill discount and 100% solar energy
 - Enrolled over 600 San José residents



Climate Smart Pillar 2: A *Vibrant City of Connected & Focused Growth*Programs and Policies

- Better Bike Plan & Trail Network
- Transportation Demand Management (TDM) and Parking Ordinance Update
- Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure
 - 1,494 Level 2, 204 fast chargers, and one Level 1 charger
 - Electric Mobility Roadmap estimated need for 3,943 Level 2 chargers and 147 fast chargers
- California EV Infrastructure Project (CALeVIP)
 - Will distribute \$16.4M in funding for Level 2 and fast charger installations through 2023



Climate Smart Pillar 3: An Economically Inclusive City of Opportunity Programs and Policies

- Building Reach Code Update
 - Updates to align with:
 - 2022 CA building code
 - Natural gas infrastructure prohibition ordinance
 - Review EV requirements
- Existing Building Electrification Plan
 - Framework to encourage the electrification of homes and businesses
 - Draft released Feb. 2022
 - Heard both support and concerns
 - Making revisions and anticipate bringing to Council in Q2 2022



Looking Ahead



- Next reporting period (March August 2022):
 - Release a Request for Information for Climate Smart partnerships to accelerate building electrification and electrification workforce development
 - Update the Climate Smart online dashboard
 - Finalize the NWL Element
 - Finalize the Solid Waste Element

Anticipated City Council Items:

- Existing Building Electrification Framework (Q2 2022)
- Carbon Neutral by 2030 Implementation Plan (Q2 2022)
- Access and Mobility Plan, Emerging Mobility Action Plan, and Transit First Policy (Q2/3 2022)
- Parking and TDM Ordinance (Q2/3 2022)
