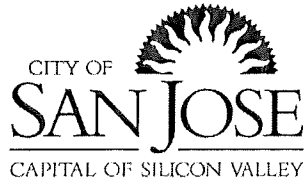

**SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF THE DISTRICT 4 SPRING CLEANING EVENT
SPONSORED BY COUNCIL DISTRICT 4 AS A CITY COUNCIL
SPONSORED SPECIAL EVENT TO EXPEND CITY FUNDS AND ACCEPT
DONATIONS OF MATERIALS AND SERVICES FOR THE EVENT**

RECOMMENDATION

1. Approve the District 4 Spring Cleaning event scheduled on April 21, 2018 as a City Council sponsored Special Event and approve the expenditure of funds.
2. Approve and accept donations from various individuals, businesses, or community groups to support the event.
3. Place the item on the February 27, 2018 City Council Agenda for action.

BACKGROUND

On February 1, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution 72517 which requires Councilmembers to submit a memorandum to the Rules Committee regarding proposed City Council sponsored Special Events and the proposed use of any funds.

The District 4 Spring Cleaning event will be held on April 21, 2018 at 3 locations across District 4 and sponsored by Councilmember Lan Diep. This special event is aimed at stemming illegal dumping and informing residents about free junk pickup. Over 30 volunteers will be participating at the event. The event is free and open to the public.

ANALYSIS

Approval by the City Council of the event will ensure compliance with the Council's prior direction regarding Council Special Events. In observance of existing fundraising disclosure requirements, Councilmember Diep will report any cash or in-kind donations received for the event on their Disclosure of Fundraising Report (DFR-1). Approval of this memorandum will enable Council District 4, City departments and the Office of the City Clerk to proceed with the

event. Any cash donations received will be processed pursuant to the City's normal financial and budgetary procedures.

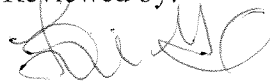
