## **Background: Types of Response & Current Local Programs**


### **Alternative Response:**

Civilian personnel with specialized skills (for example, mental health clinicians) respond to incidents without a police officer being present.



#### **Co-Response:**

Specialized civilian personnel respond to incidents along with police officers – either simultaneously or after officers secure the incident site.



## **Background: Council Direction**

Explore Co-Response and Alternative Response models for individuals with Feb. 2024 City Council disabilities Direction Explore Alternative Response models for select calls for service involving individuals with mental health issues and/or unhoused individuals Explore Co-Response models for Domestic Violence calls for service Partner with County of Santa Clara to identify opportunities for expanded FY 2024-2025 Direction Alternative Response and 911-to-988 call diversion Budget Transfer \$450,000 to the County of Santa Clara to fund an additional 40 hours of TRUST coverage for a one-year period; explore whether opioid settlement funding could be used to fund Alternative Response programs

# Alternative & Co-Response: Disability Findings

**#1** Disability community – call for prioritization and expanded funding of Alternative response over Co-response programs

#2 Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) compares or exceeds other CITs across the nation; rooted in community partnership; City could continuously evaluate for alignment with community need and City's Disability Inclusion Equity Pledge.

**#3** Co-response program PERT pairs a SJPD officer with a County clinician; the program could be expanded by partnering with the County to hire additional clinicians.

**Other Policy Options for Consideration** 

- Voluntary Disclosure Programs Blue Envelope Program
- Designation of Disability Affairs Coordinator within SJPD
- Funding appropriation for MCAT, TRUST to increase specialized resources

# **Alternative Response**


### Findings

**#4** Ongoing City-County collaboration to identify opportunities to expand its current 911-to-988 call transfer pilot program.

**#5** Completed Memorandum of Agreement with the County to effectuate City Council's allocation of \$450,000 to fund a one-year TRUST pilot expansion; monitoring implementation.

**#6** Opioid settlement funds are not suitable for existing alternative response programs.

**#7** City identifying and leveraging opportunities to educate residents on services available through County's 988 Call Center through existing City programs.

### **Co-Response: Domestic Violence**

### Findings

**#8** Other jurisdictions have co-response teams dedicated to providing in-person responses to domestic violence incidents. The City could explore creating a new program to augment the existing response model.

**#9** San José Police Department partners with YWCA on the Domestic Violence High Risk Response Team program. In-person co-responses are limited, and the program could be adjusted to increase them.
