SUBJECT: Public Hearing on Residential Garbage and Recycling Services Rates for Single-Family and Multi-Family Residential Solid Waste Services

REASON FOR SUPPLEMENTAL

This supplemental memorandum reports on the written protests received in response to public notices regarding proposed Residential Garbage and Recycling services rates, effective July 1, 2025.

ANALYSIS

Notices were mailed to 235,983 residential property owners advising them that a public hearing would be held on June 3, 2025, regarding City Council consideration of Residential Garbage and Recycling service rates proposed to take effect July 1, 2025. In accordance with Proposition 218, customers were given at least 45 days to file written protests of the proposed rate increases.

As of Wednesday, May 28, 2025, the City Clerk's Office has received 689 protests in response to the Residential Garbage and Recycling public notice, which represents less than one percent of all customers impacted by the rate changes. Protest letters may be submitted through the close of the public hearing, at which point the City Clerk will provide a count of all protests received during the protest period.

To enhance customer service and mirror steps being taken for water and sewer customers, the City issued responses to property owners submitting protests (Attachment). Inclusion of this notice herein serves as the City's response to any written protests received at the time of the hearing.

Dear San José Property Owner:

This message is to acknowledge your written protest to the City of San José's proposed Residential Garbage and Recycling Service utility rate increase proposal. We understand that this proposed increase is an additional cost to you. Here is some additional information about the need for it.

As stated in the rate notice you received, the proposed rate increase is required for the City's solid waste contractors to continue to provide garbage and recycling services at full cost recovery. The proposed rate changes will pay for cost-of-living adjustments, fuel, and other costs which enable City contractors to provide collection and processing of garbage, recycling, yard trimmings, and unlimited junk pickup services, among others. These solid waste services comply with local ordinances and state laws, protecting public health and safety.

San José makes every effort to reduce the need for rate adjustments and to keep costs low. San José residents helped keep this year's rate impacts to a minimum by recycling right and reducing recycling contamination.
