AN UNCODIFIED ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE TO DESIGNATE SPECIFIED AREAS OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE AS A MAJOR EVENT ZONE TO PROHIBIT CERTAIN **ACTIVITIES** ON **PUBLIC PROPERTY** INCLUDING PEDDLING, DISTRIBUTION OF GOODS COUPONS MERCHANDISE, OR FOR Α AND COMMERCIAL PURPOSE, THE SALE OF COUNTERFEIT MERCHANDISE TO FACILITATE THE OPTIMUM USE THESE AREAS IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MAJOR EVENTS AND RELATED ACTIVITIES DURING THE FOLLOWING TIME PERIODS: BEGINNING AT SIX O'CLOCK (6:00) A.M. ON FRIDAY JANUARY 23, 2026 THROUGH SIX O'CLOCK (6:00) P.M. ON TUESDAY FEBRUARY 10, 2026 FOR NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE SUPER BOWL LX; BEGINNING AT SIX O'CLOCK (6:00) A.M. ON FRIDAY MARCH 13, 2026 THROUGH SIX O'CLOCK (6:00) P.M. ON TUESDAY 31, MARCH 2026 FOR **POTENTIAL NATIONAL** TECHNOLOGY CONFERENCE AND THE NATIONAL COLLEGIATE ATHLETIC **ASSOCIATION** MEN'S BASKETBALL WEST REGIONAL GAMES: BEGINNING SIX O'CLOCK (6:00) A.M. ON FRIDAY JUNE 5, 2026 THROUGH SIX O'CLOCK (6:00) P.M. ON SUNDAY JULY 2026 FOR 21, **FEDERATION** INTERNATIONALE DE FOOTBALL **ASSOCIATION WORLD CUP 26**

WHEREAS, the City of San José ("City") anticipates several national and international destination events will be hosted in local venues and occupying San José hotels with each event attracting between 50,000 to 100,000 visitors with the potential of \$350 million in estimated economic impact on the City and the State of California ("Major Events"); and

WHEREAS, these Major Events, including the National Football League (NFL) Super Bowl LX, a potential international technology conference, National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Men's Basketball West Regional Games ("March Madness"), and

the Federation Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) World Cup 26, each have

dates for the games or conference, and related events in February, March, June and

July 2026, respectively; and

WHEREAS, San José will be a destination market with thousands of visitors,

dignitaries, and media personnel anticipated to be in attendance, it is necessary that

commercial activities within certain areas in and around events related to the Major

Events within the City be regulated and controlled to provide for the public health,

safety, and welfare of the participants and the general public so that the maximum

benefits of all the Major Events and related events have to offer may be enjoyed by all;

and

WHEREAS, each of the sport Major Events will bring in fans, visiting teams and host

organizations to San Jose hotels including downtown San Jose Marriott, Signia by

Hilton, Hilton, Doubletree, Hyatt Place, AC Marriott, Hotel De Anza, Residence Inn, the

Hayes Mansion, and Hotel Valencia; and

WHEREAS. NFL Super Bowl is the 10th largest internationally viewed sporting event

beginning with opening media day that could be hosted at the SAP Center offering

related public activation opportunities to welcome team and fans to potential sites such

as Plaza de Cesar Chavez, Convention Center, Civic Auditorium, California Theatre,

Hammer Theatre, Arena Green, and San Pedro Square; and

WHEREAS, the SAP Center will serve as the practice and tournament site for the

NCAA Men's Basketball West Regional Games with proposed "Hoop It Up" community

engagement events at San Pedro Square and other downtown sites; and

WHEREAS, FIFA World Cup is the most highly watched international sporting event,

and six games will be held at Levi's Stadium with practice venues at PayPal Park and

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San Jose State University; and

WHEREAS, there are potential events such as official and unofficial community watch

parties in locations like San Pedro Square or interested restaurants and venues,

CityDance, a downtown concert series, and culinary, public and visual art exhibitions;

and

WHEREAS, commercial activities conducted in proximity to the Major Events and

related events would create congestion and unnecessarily increase the number of

vehicles and pedestrians in the vicinity of Downtown San José, SAP, PayPal and San

José State University's Spartan Stadium, obstruct lines of sight, hinder security

operations and interfere with emergency vehicle access; and

WHEREAS, City officials who have familiarity with traffic and public safety issues have

similar concerns that Downtown San José and adjacent areas where the Major Events

and related events are scheduled to occur could become overly congested by attracting

congregations of temporary structures, outdoor sales, and distribution of merchandise;

and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to promote and protect good order, a pleasing

aesthetic environment and the safety and convenience of drivers and pedestrians in and

around the facilities relating to the Major Events and related events; and

WHEREAS, to that end, it is necessary to establish a Major Event Zone in areas within

the City where Major Events and related events are scheduled to occur for the

temporary time period and within the specified boundaries designated in this ordinance;

and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of San José is the decision-making body for this

Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions and requirements of the California

Environmental Quality Act of 1970, together with related State CEQA Guidelines and

Title 21 of the San José Municipal Code (collectively, "CEQA"), the Director of Planning,

Building and Code Enforcement has determined that the provisions of this Ordinance do

not constitute a project, under Public Project File No. PP17-011, Temporary special

events resulting in no changes to the physical environment; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN

JOSE:

SECTION 1. That there is hereby established a Major Event Zone as follows:

A. BEGINNING at the place where Interstate 280 passes over California Route 87,

thence running:

1. east by northeast along the southern edge of Interstate 280 to the place

where Interstate 280 passes over South 6th Street; thence

2. north, along the eastern edge of South 6th Street to the intersection of the

centerlines of South 6th Street and East San Salvador Street, thence

3. west, along the northern edge of East San Salvador Street to the

centerlines of East San Salvador Street and South 4th Street, thence

4. east, along the southern edge of East San Fernando Street to the

centerlines of East San Fernando Street and South 6th Street, thence

5. north by northwest along the eastern edge of South 6th Street to the

intersection of the centerlines of North 6th Street and East St. James

Street, thence

6. west by southwest along the northern edge of East St. James Street, and

continuing west by southwest along the northern edge of West Julian

Street, to the intersection of the centerlines of West Julian Street and

Stockton Avenue; thence

7. south along the western edge of Stockton Avenue, continuing south along

the western edge of White Street and further continuing south along the

Caltrain tracks to the intersection of the centerlines of the Caltrain tracks

and Park Avenue; thence

8. east, and continuing northeast, along the southern edge of Park Avenue to

the intersection of the centerlines of Park Avenue and Delmas Avenue:

thence

9. south, and continuing southwest, along the western edge of Delmas

Avenue to the place where Delmas Avenue ends at the entrance onto

California Route 87; thence

10. south by southeast along the western edge of California Route 87 to the

place where California Route 87 passes under Interstate 280 at the point

and place of beginning.

B. BEGINNING at the intersection of the centerlines South 7th Street and East

Humboldt Street, thence running:

1. south along the western edge of South 7th Street to the intersection of the

centerlines of South 7th Street and East Alma Avenue; thence

2. east, and continuing northeast, along the southern edge of East Alma

Avenue to the intersection of the centerlines of East Alma Avenue and

South 10th Street; thence

3. north, and continuing northwest, along the eastern edge of South 10th

Street to the intersection of the centerlines of South 10th Street and East

Humboldt Street; thence

4. west, and continuing southwest, along the northern edge of East

Humboldt Street to centerlines of East Humboldt Street and South 7th

Street at the point and place of beginning.

C. A map of the Major Event Zone is attached hereto as Exhibit A and available on

file in the office of the City Clerk.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The Major Event Zone defined in Section 1 shall have duration(s)

beginning at six o'clock (6:00) a.m. on Friday January 23, 2026 through six o'clock

(6:00) p.m. on Tuesday February 10, 2026 for National Football League Super Bowl LX;

beginning at six o'clock (6:00) a.m. on Friday March 13, 2026 through six o'clock (6:00)

p.m. on Tuesday March 31, 2026 for potential national technology conference and the

National Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Basketball West Regional Games; and

beginning six o'clock (6:00) a.m. on Friday June 5, 2026 through six o'clock (6:00) p.m.

on Sunday July 21, 2026 for Federation Internationale de Football Association World

Cup 26.

SECTION 3.

A. All approved location permits issued pursuant to Chapter 6.54 of the San José

Municipal Code for approved locations within the Major Event Zone designated in

Section 1 of this ordinance shall be suspended during the time period designated

in Section 2 of this ordinance.

B. If any such permit holder peddles at the alternative approved location designated

in the permit, the permit shall only be suspended in part, as applied to the

primary approved location, and shall remain in full force and effect as applied to

the alternative approved location, subject to Section of this ordinance.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Any person holding an approved location permit issued pursuant to

Chapter 6.54 of the San José Municipal Code within the Major Event Zone designated

by Section 1 of this ordinance may peddle at any alternative approved location

designated in his or her approved location permit in compliance with all terms and

conditions of the permit, provided the alternative approved location is not within the

Major Event Zone or within a special event boundary designated pursuant to Chapter

6.55 of the San José Municipal Code.

SECTION 5. It shall be unlawful for any person, including persons holding a peddler's

permit issued pursuant to Chapter 6.54 of the San José Municipal Code, to peddle

within the Major Event Zone designated by Section 1 of this ordinance during the time

period designated in Section 2 of this ordinance.

Α. Exemptions. This Section shall not apply to Mobile Unit peddlers, as defined in

Chapter 6.54 of the San José Municipal Code, operating between the hours of

7:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M. or 11:00 A.M. and 1:00 P.M. that have an agreement(s)

with construction projects located within the Major Event Zone.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> Pursuant to Section 13.20.010 of Chapter 13.20 of Title 13 of the San José Municipal Code, it shall be unlawful for a person to place any booth, table, chair, stool, object, structure, vehicle, or piece of equipment in any public area located within a

Major Event Zone designated by Section 1 of this ordinance during the time period

designated in Section 2 of this ordinance without the consent of the City.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation, directly or indirectly, to distribute upon any street, sidewalk or public right-of-way within the Major Event Zone, defined in Section 1, any free merchandise, free sample goods or coupons for the purpose of advertising any commodity, article, merchandise, business,

meeting, entertainment or activity for a commercial purpose.

SECTION 8. It shall be unlawful for any person to intentionally sell, knowingly possess

for sale, or distribute any illegal or counterfeit merchandise within the City of San José.

SECTION 9. Violation of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor. All remedies for violation of the San José Municipal Code set forth in Title 1 of said code shall apply to violations of this Ordinance, including, but not limited to the administrative citation provisions of Section 1.15.030. The amount of the administrative citation fine imposed for violation of this Ordinance shall be set forth in this Ordinance, not the amount set forth in the schedule of fines established by resolution of this Council adopted pursuant to Section 1.15.040A. For purposes of enforcement of Chapter 1.15 of Title 1 of the San José Municipal Code, the administrative citation fine amount for a violation of this Ordinance shall be as follows:

A. Violations of Section 5:

1. First Violation: \$500.00

2. Second Violation: \$1,500.00

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<u>SECTION 10.</u> This ordinance shall be and is hereby declared to be cumulative of all other ordinances of the City of San José, and this ordinance shall not operate to repeal or affect any of such other ordinances, however, insofar as the provisions thereof might be inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, the provisions and requirements in this ordinance control and apply over such conflicting provisions to the extent necessary to fulfill the requirements and purposes of this ordinance.

SECTION 11. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance adopted by the City Council of the City of San José is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of such ordinance. Each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of any ordinance is severable from all other sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases unless such ordinance contains a provision which states that the council would not have passed the remainder of such ordinance if it had known that any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of the ordinance would subsequently be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 12. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be in effect until July 22, 2026.
