A. Report on Request for Proposal for Citywide Security Guard Services.

Staff Recommendation to Committee for City Council:

Accept the report on the Request for Proposal and adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager to:

(a)Negotiate and execute agreements with Good Guard Security, Inc. (Chatsworth, CA) for security guard services for the Airport, Transportation, Public Works, Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services, Library, and Environmental Services Departments with an initial 14-month term beginning on or about February 1, 2023 and ending March 31, 2024, with a total aggregate compensation for all agreements not to exceed \$9,048,442 for the initial term, subject to the appropriation of funds.
(b)Negotiate and execute amendments and change orders as required to add, delete, or modify services, such as for special events, or to address seasonal variations, budgetary constraints, or unanticipated changes in demand, subject to the appropriation of funds.
(c)Exercise up to four one-year options to extend the terms of the agreements through March 31, 2028, subject to the appropriation of funds.

(d)Negotiate and execute additional agreements or purchase orders with Good Guard Security, Inc. leveraging the same Request for Proposal to provide security guard services for other City departments as requested, subject to substantially the same material terms and conditions and the appropriation of funds.

7. <u>STATUS OF ITEMS PREVIOUSLY RECOMMENDED FOR APPROVAL BY TPAC</u>

A. Master Service Agreement with HydroScience Engineers, Incorporated for Engineering Consulting Services for the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility.

Staff Recommendation to Committee for City Council:

Adopt a resolution delegating authority to the City Manager or designee to execute a Master Service Agreement with HydroScience Engineers, Incorporated, for various Operations and Maintenance projects requiring engineering support and services on an as needed basis at the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility. The terms of the agreement shall be for a four-year term with a total not to exceed amount of \$2,500,000, subject to annual appropriation of funds.

This item was approved by City Council on December 13, 2022.

B. Second Amendment to the Master Consultant Agreement with Stantec Consulting Services Inc. for Program Management Services for the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility Capital Improvement Program.

Staff Recommendation to Committee for City Council:

(a) Approve the second amendment to the Master Consultant Agreement with Stantec Consulting Services Inc. for program management services for the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility Capital Improvement Program, increasing the not-to-exceed agreement amount from \$78,000,000 to a revised not-to-exceed agreement amount of \$92,000,000; and extending the term of the agreement from June 30, 2023 to June 30, 2026.

(b) Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager to exercise the City's option to extend the agreement for up to two additional one-year terms, with compensation for each additional one-year term not to exceed \$4,000,000, depending on program needs and subject to the appropriation of funds.

This item was approved by City Council on December 13, 2022.

C. Award of Dewatered Biosolids Transportation and Beneficial Use Service Agreements for the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility.

Staff Recommendation to Committee for City Council:

(a) Adopt a resolution approving the Addendum to the Environmental Impact Report for the San José-Santa Clara Water Pollution Control Plant Master Plan (SCH #2011052074), Biosolids Disposition Project, File No. ER20-129, in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), as amended.

(b) Approve and execute the following dewatered biosolids transportation and beneficial use service agreements to manage the dewatered biosolids produced annually by the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility:

(1) Denali Water Solutions, LLC to manage approximately 35% of the dewatered biosolids produced annually by the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility through June 30, 2029, with options to extend through June 30, 2033, and a maximum compensation of \$18,400,000, subject to the appropriation of funds.

(2) Synagro West, LLC to manage approximately 57% of the dewatered biosolids produced annually by the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility through June 30, 2029, with options to extend through June 30, 2033, and a maximum compensation of \$29,600,000, subject to the appropriation of funds.
(3) Lystek International Limited to manage approximately 8% of the dewatered biosolids produced annually by the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility through June 30, 2029, with options to extend through June 30, 2033, and a maximum compensation of \$7,300,000, subject to the appropriation of funds.
(c) Adopt a resolution delegating authority to the City Manager or their designee to negotiate and execute amendments to the biosolid transportation and beneficial use service agreements with Denali Water Solutions, LLC, Synagro West, LLC, and Lystek International Limited to account for necessary changes to the percentage of the dewatered biosolids managed under each agreement and the corresponding compensation and/or execute extensions to the initial term of the agreement so long as such amendments do

D. Agreement with Santa Clara Valley Habitat Agency Establishing a 201-Acre Conservation Easement as Land-in-Lieu of Fees for the Burrowing Owl Habitat at the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility

Staff Recommendation to Committee for City Council:

Approve a Conservation Easement-In-Lieu of Fees agreement with Santa Clara Valley Habitat Agency that establishes an approximate 201-acre conservation easement over the Western Burrowing Owl Habitat at the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility as land-in-lieu of paying development fees for certain projects in the Capital Improvement Program and the corresponding Conservation Easement Agreement.
