	district with two members then that Commissioner must notify the
	City Clerk, but may complete their current term.
	b. Provide that Commissioners may be reappointed no more than
	once.
	2. Direct the City Attorney to draft, and return to Council with, a
	Charter amendment for the November 2020 ballot that would align
	the Planning Commission to the structure of other Council
	nominated commissions to include 11 members with one from each
	Council District and one at-large member.
	a. Direct the City Manager and City Attorney to look for other
	necessary Charter changes or clean-up actions to reduce election
	costs that could be included with this amendment.
	3. Amend the Lobbyist Ordinance (Chapter 12.12) to prohibit an
	individual who has been a registered lobbyist within the previous two

a. Improve the clarity of online applications and the format in which the Councilmembers receive these applications.

b. Reevaluate the prohibition on communication with applicants prior to the public interview to better allow Councilmembers to evaluate applicants.
