		ii. 45% for permanent supportive and affordable rental housing for extremely low-income (ELI) households-defined as
		earning less than 30% of area median income (AMI),
		iii. 35% for affordable rental housing for 30%-80% AMI
		households, and
		iv. 10% for below market-rate for-sale housing and
		moderate-income rental housing-up to and including 120%
		AMI-including rent-restricted ADU forgivable loans, down payment assistance, and first-time homeownership opportunities for
		households up to 120% AMI.
		4. We also propose further transparency and accountability of the
		City Council's spending decisions relating to revenue from the real
		property transfer tax revenue, in addition to the already-directed
		requirement of a two-thirds Council vote amending any spending
		priorities and establishment of an Oversight Committee:
		a. Requiring a 60-day notice and at least two public hearings prior to
		the Council taking action on any proposed change to the annual
		spending plan that could shift any funding, and
		b. Creating a separate accounting for the revenues generated by the measure for the purposes of oversight by the Oversight Committee.
