#### Chris.

Construction on our facility expansion is well underway. At this point, the significant work of demolition, underground utilities, slab on grade and seismic fire walls have been constructed. In the coming months we look forward to our building taking shape with steel erection and interior spaces beginning to take form. This expansion has come with lots of hard work by our group and City staff to bring this project life. We are very excited for our community and thank you for your support!

Please find the annual report for fiscal year 2019-20 at Sharks Ice at San Jose. As we know the Covid-19 pandemic has turned our society upside down and our facility was no exception. Our doors were shuttered on March 27th per County directives and re-opened June 8th to kick off our annual Sharks Summer Hockey School after implementing comprehensive Covid-19 safety protocols to ensure our patrons could enjoy our ice facilities.

We continued to operate our facility at a level as low as 10% of capacity per County directives through the end of FY 20. Despite this challenging environment, our rink community showed their passion and loyalty to our ice sports programming with strong participation in cohort-based youth ice skating and hockey. Despite Covid-19 closures knocking out 4 months of our operation, this fiscal year we had 80,690 public skating customers.

Thanks to Chris for all his efforts. We continue to have strong relationships with all the "South Campus" stakeholders and kudos to him for continuing to bring the group together. With our





facility expansion underway and the construction of the SJSU parking garage, we are excited for the hustle and bustle to return in our neighborhood in the short term.

#### Hockey

Youth-in house hockey – Currently Sharks Ice offers two separate seasons (winter/summer). We changed our in-house model to comply with the new ADM directive from USA Hockey. In 2013, we were named a "Model Club" by USA Hockey for our successes. In-house hockey is designed for pure development and the fun of the game. Last season, we had 43 teams and 557 players in our winter season. These programs offer participation twice weekly, one mid-week practice and one weekend game. Teams are picked by the hockey department to ensure parody. Ice times are based on age grouping. Traditionally, in-house hockey receives some of the most desirable ice time, due to the fact it is the feeder program for the Tier and Travel program. This program was halted at the completion of the Winter Season due to the Covid-19 closure.

Adult in-house hockey – Sharks Ice currently offers 11 different skill levels for our adult customers. We currently have the largest adult hockey program in the US and have been recognized by USA Hockey as being the largest for the past 10 years. In 2019-2020 we had 2,621 adult players in San Jose. Our season was cut short by a few games due to Covid-19 closures and did not host a Summer season. A major concern coming out of Covid-19 is that our adult players have been off the ice for a full year. While we have been in constant communication with this group, we are concerned with retention due to the time off.

Jr. Sharks Hockey Club –The Jr. Sharks Hockey Club is currently the 2nd largest amateur hockey club in California with **524 participants/families fielding 29 teams** (20 boy's teams/ 9 girl's teams). The program consists of three levels, Tier AA/AAA, Travel A/B, and Girls/Women's. Our club participants were most impacted by the lack of Spring programming due to Covid-19 closures.

Girls/Women's Hockey – Girls/women's hockey has continued to grow here in the Bay Area and our Jr Sharks Girls/women's program now has 170 participants. The number of participants has doubled in the past 5 years.

Sharks High School Hockey Program – Due to the popularity of our High School program, other venues in the area are now offering High School hockey. Furthermore, it has become so popular that USA Hockey now has a National Championship tournament dedicated to High School





hockey. This is very encouraging for the future of our sport! Due to the rapid rise and future importance of the High School Program, we have hired a full time High School Hockey Coordinator. In 2019-2020 we had a total number of 37 high school teams with 650 participants. We also receive an annual grant from the NHL to help grow our HS program. Our high school participants were most impacted by the lack of Spring programming due to Covid-19 closures.

Drop-in Hockey -Sharks Ice offers drop-in hockey every Monday - Friday from noon-1:30pm.

#### Figure Skating

Lesson Programming –Sharks Ice has a thriving learn to skate program. Lesson series are offered quarterly and parents and participants have the choice to participate during the week or on weekends. We designate our best ice time to accommodate families and young children. Last season we had **4,072** children and adults go through our lesson programs. Growth in this program is a clear indicator for future success. Our learn to skate program did not host a Spring or Summer lesson series due Covid-19 closures.

Freestyle/Figure Skating –Sharks Ice offers a large quantity of private ice for aspiring figure skaters in California. This year we had **16,386** freestyle sessions. The ice time is usually Monday - Friday very early in the morning (before school). Peninsula Figure Skating Club buys ice weekly for their members. Solar4Amerca Ice is very fortunate to have nationally recognized coaches to attract and teach our figure skating patrons. During months we were allowed to operate due to Covid – 19 impacts, we offered youth cohort based skating camps which were at full capacity and enjoyed by many thankful customers.

Dance Programming – Sharks Ice is currently one of four sites in the United States that has a high-end Ice Dance Program. Headed up by Sergi and Marina Ponamaranko, couples from all over the world come to San Jose for instruction.

Public Skating - With the addition of the 4th rink, public session is offered daily. We had **80,690** customers skate this fiscal year in our public sessions. This number represents 8 months of public skate participation and looks to be one of the last components of our programming allowed to return due to Covid-19 re-opening directives.





#### **Other Programming**

Curling - We are one of five ice rinks in Northern California that offers the sport of curling. We have the largest arena curling club in the United States. We have a thriving curling program and three curling leagues, one in San Jose, Fremont and Oakland. With the popularity of curling during the Olympics in 2014 and 2018, interest in the sport has exploded. Most of our corporate events now involve curling opposed to broomball due to is low-impact nature. While Covid-19 negatively impacted this segment of our business, we do expect a resurgence of interest due to the upcoming Winter Olympics in 2022.

Speed Skater Session - Every Sunday morning Sharks Ice offers 1.5 hours of ice to local speed skaters.

Ice Dance Session - For Ice Dancers only (very recreational) is offered Sunday mornings.

#### **Community Programs-**

Sharks Ice Free Use Program – Sharks Ice offers to at risk school children from San Jose the ability to skate free during a school session. The children participate on public session ice. For 2019-2020, we had a total of 2,088 kids participated in this program, which translates to \$36,540 in donation. Since the building has opened, we have provided \$1,786,460 to this program. This program was greatly impacted as unfortunately we missed many of our annual end of school year and summer field trips due to Covid-19 closures. \*See attached document for detail of community groups who attended this program.

Sharks Ice Special Needs Program – Every Friday, Sharks Ice makes 1.5 hrs. of ice for our special needs program. This program becomes more and popular from year to year. For the past two years we have had a waiting list for every session we have offered for special needs.

Sharks Ice Free Use Lessons-Every quarter, we give 12 scholarships for free lesson series to children within the community.

Home school Fridays - For a nominal fee (\$11/person), home school children and families can participate in the sport of ice-skating. We also hold home school lessons.





#### **Economic Impacts-**

It is important to note the Sharks Ice continues to be a leader in the community regarding booking hotel rooms in San Jose. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, we provided 3,692 (3,077 provided by Room Roster plus 20% factor) hotel rooms to the City of San Jose and surrounding area. We continue to see over 1 million visitors per year.

### Sharks Ice at San Jose, the Facility-

We are very proud of all the recent upgrades made to the facility as this allows us to be regarded as one of the top ice recreational facilities in North America. It is important to note that during this expansion several critical infrastructure improvements are also being made to the existing building such as: rebuilding rink 3 refrigeration and HVAC components, site lighting, BMS, security and restroom modernization. The goal is to make sure the entire facility flows and that you cannot tell from a new building to a 28-year-old building.

Maintenance Expenditures – In 2019-2020, Sharks Ice LLC spent the following dollars on the facility:

a. Labor	\$ 1,295,652 (custodians, leads, ice techs, and cashiers)

Labor – Engineers \$ 30,831

b. Build Ground/Maint. \$ 92,221 (landscape, parking lot, trash, fire etc.)

c. Zamboni Operation \$ 68,663 (propane, maintenance)

d. HVAC \$ 27,558 (maintenance and repair)

e. Electrical \$ 20,517 (maintenance and repair)

f. Water Treatment \$ 37,140

g. Plumbing \$ 27,450

h. Ice Plant \$ 59,838 (material/labor, includes cooling towers)

Emergency Resources Network. Team San Jose has been very active during the
pandemic, including housing and feeding 250 people on-site and providing meals for
15,000 people per week. With virus cases surging, the ERN's leadership team
discussed measures to take in the event hospitals run out of on-site space.

- South Campus Operations Team. Construction in the south campus area includes the
  expansion of Solar4America Ice at San Jose, building a number of new sports facilities
  and a 1,500 space parking garage at San Jose State University and the construction of
  a new San Jose Fire Training Center just south of Excite Ballpark Home of the San Jose
  Giants.

Since 2008, the San Jose Arena Authority has served as custodian to the management agreement between the City of San Jose and the Baseball Acquisition Company (BAC/San Jose Giants) for Excite Ballpark Home of the San Jose Giants. One of the oldest professional baseball stadiums in the United States, the 78-year old ballpark is the home of the San Jose Giants.

On December 2, the San Jose Arena Authority Board of Directors approved a stadium capital budget plan for Fiscal Year 2020-21. Below is a list of recommended stadium capital improvements approved by the Board:

Beginning in 2019, the San Jose Giants signed a three-year stadium naming-rights agreement with Excite Credit Union. The original annual naming-rights payments are listed below:

Term Year I (2019): \$65,000 Term Year II (2020): \$105,000 Term Year III (2021): \$105,000

With the cancellation of the 2020 California League baseball season due to the Coronavirus pandemic, the adjusted Excite Credit Union payment for 2020 is listed below. Also listed is the Giants' minimum annual payment made to the City (as determined in the management agreement with no games played) and will be directed to stadium capital improvements:

As you recall during the stadium tour, we inspected and discussed the rapid deterioration of the stadium on-site parking lot. Besides the poor surface conditions of the parking lot, which in areas are public hazards, there was also the issue of removing a chain-linked fence behind the stadium. Removing the fence and clearing out and paving the area would add 35-40 new, on-site parking spaces. With construction moving forward at Solar4America Ice at San Jose, this would be an appropriate time to continue discussions to replace the on-site Excite Ballpark parking lot. Under normal circumstances, the stadium and ice center have year-round access to the lot. In recognizing this, we should take the opportunity to find funding to ensure the safety, function and longevity of the aging, crumbling stadium parking lot.
