Approve the Master Consultant Agreement with Black & Veatch Corporation for various Operations and Maintenance (O&M) training and support activities at the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility (RWF) for a full term through June 30, 2026 for a maximum not-to-exceed aggregate compensation amount of \$3,750,000, subject to the annual appropriation of funds.

Staff Recommendation:

Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute the First Amendment to the Agreement between the Santa Clara Valley Habitat Agency and the City of San José for Burrowing Owl Habitat Management at the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility to increase the term from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2026.

H. Amend Purchase Order OP59514 for Lagoon Dredge Rental Services Staff Recommendation:

Authorize the City Manager to amend open purchase order OP 59514 with Dredge America, Inc. (Kansas City, MO) for lagoon dredge rental services to increase compensation by \$200,000, for a revised maximum compensation not-to-exceed \$520,000, and retroactively continue and extend the current purchase order term from September 18, 2020 through July 31, 2021.

As amended: 2. Execute up to two (2) additional one-year options to extend the term of the purchase order with the last option year ending on or about July 31, 2023, subject to the annual appropriation of funds.
