## **Background**

In 2010, the Arena Authority created the South Campus Operations Team (SCOT). Today the team includes representatives from Sharks Ice at San Jose, Excite Ballpark Home of the San Jose Giants, Kelley Park (including Happy Hollow Park & Zoo and History Park), San Jose State University Athletics, the Office of Cultural Affairs, the City's Department of Public Works, the San Jose Police Department, and the Arena Authority. In creating the South Campus Operations Team, the Arena Authority established two central missions for the organization: (1) Allow for the open and regular interaction of facility and park operators in the areas of park and facility event administration; coordination of vehicular traffic and parking operations and inventories; simultaneous event planning and administration; patron ingress and egress management; identification of neighborhood integrity issues; and special event coordination. (2) Expand substantive discussions for the long-term planning and development of the South Campus area. Fostered by the leadership of the Arena Authority, both goals for the South Campus area continue to be addressed through the active engagement of City and area stakeholders.

During 2021, members of the Team worked under limited operational conditions brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. This report reflects the Team's efforts under those conditions.

## **Kelley Park**

Kelley Park has been a popular regional destination for over 60 years, offering one of the City's most diverse recreational settings. Covering 172 acres, the park includes Happy Hollow Park & Zoo, the Japanese Friendship Garden, History Park, the Vietnamese Heritage Garden, and a newly constructed section of the Coyote Creek trail. The park also features picnic areas, reservable wedding sites, an amphitheater, and a disc golf course. Under ordinary circumstances, the park annually welcomes over 450,000 visitors.

The Japanese Friendship Garden is modeled after the Korakuen Gardens located in San Jose's Sister City of Okayama, Japan. The garden features streams, bridges, wedding areas, a Japanese Tea House, and koi-filled ponds. Two of the three koi ponds are currently empty pending completion of design and construction work to repair the water treatment plant. However, over 150 koi are still on display in the pond at the upper northeast corner of the park.

## Happy Hollow Park & Zoo

Happy Hollow Park & Zoo has brought family-friendly outdoor enjoyment to San Jose since 1961. The Park & Zoo feature puppet shows, rides, nature-inspired play areas, and a zoo that has been accredited by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums since 1993. Doc's Critter Care, an on-site veterinary clinic, serves more than 130 endangered, exotic, domestic, and rescued animals.

The Happy Hollow Education Program features summer and school-break camps, as well as on-site classes for all ages. The program also offers educational outreach, field trips, and scholarship programs for children, youth, scouts, and school groups. Eco-friendly public events, family sleepovers, celebrations, and private rentals of all sizes are some of the park's signature offerings.

As the first LEED Gold certified amusement park and zoo in the United States, Happy Hollow's operations center around conservation and sustainability while aligning with the City of San Jose's environmental services initiatives. On a broader scale, the Park & Zoo engage in local and global wildlife conservation and research programs.

The Happy Hollow Foundation is the registered nonprofit partner of Happy Hollow Park & Zoo and has helped fund new animal exhibits, rides, and programs. Signature efforts include Senior Safari, an event series that helps combat social isolation and gets seniors moving by offering a free morning at Happy Hollow. The foundation also offers funding for education outreach visits to Title I schools in Santa Clara County, and recently began a scholarship program to bring some of these underserved schools to Happy Hollow for a full day of fun and learning.

## **History Park**

History San José is a private, nonprofit organization that manages the City of San Jose's historic assets including the Collection Center/Research Library & Archive, Downtown San Jose's Gonzales/Peralta Adobe-Fallon House Historic Site, and History Park in Kelley Park. History Park features 30 historic and replica buildings, including the Chinese American Historical Museum, the Pacific Hotel, Stevens Fruit Barn, a working print shop, and running trolleys. History Park is also home to more than 200 volunteers and 19 nonprofit affiliates and community partner organizations, each of which provides exhibits and programming that showcase their constituencies and contributions to the Valley.

History Park is a destination for experiencing and celebrating the Valley's cultural heritage. Events focus on active inner-generational engagement, enjoyment, and learning through a combination of hands-on crafts, storytelling, cultural performances, and family-friendly experiences. Each year the park welcomes more than 100,000 visitors to events like the *Dia de Portugal Festival*, *Spirit of '45 WWII* Event, and *Antique Autos at History Park*. In addition, History Park serves more than 10,000 school children from Santa Clara Valley, Fremont, Santa Cruz, and the Peninsula. History San José offers theme-based school programs, like Westward Ho!, and Adobe Days, that are focused on national, regional, and local history designed to teach students core competencies required for 21st-century life, while emphasizing critical thinking, self-directed learning, and collaboration.

## Excite Ballpark Home of the San Jose Giants

Excite Ballpark Home of the San Jose Giants was completed in 1942 as a Work Projects Administration (WPA) government program. Over the years, the stadium has served as the residence for a number of professional baseball teams; and for the past three-plus decades the ballpark has been the home of the California League San Jose Giants, the Class A Affiliate of the San

Francisco Giants. Nearly eight million fans have attended Giants games at the stadium and the organization is proud to provide fun, affordable, family entertainment to Silicon Valley. The Cityowned ballpark is used for over 140 events annually, including a variety of baseball activities such as youth clinics, high school regular season games, Central Coast Section playoff and championship games, San Jose State University baseball games, and San Jose Giants regular and post-season games. Other events at the stadium include scout campouts, weddings, drive-in movies, the *Bacon and Beer Classic*, corporate events, and fireworks shows.

In 2021, the team brought home its 12<sup>th</sup> championship in organization history and the first since 2010. Although much of 2021 had the stadium at limited capacity due to COVID-19 protocols, the San Jose Giants championship-clinching victory took place in front of a sold-out crowd on September 25. Recent stadium improvements included clubhouse upgrades, enhanced small group and multi-purpose space down the first-base line, along with new food offerings and craft beer stands. The Giants also continue to wow fans with their 26' by 36' high-definition video board to capture all the action on the field.

## Sharks Ice at San Jose

Sharks Ice at San Jose continues to be the most active, publicly used ice facility in the Western United States. Since opening in 1994, the facility has been expanded twice and now features four ice rinks, a pro shop for figure skating and ice hockey merchandise and equipment, a full-service restaurant/sports bar, locker rooms, food concession area, ice skating rentals, and public training space. Sharks Ice at San Jose serves as the San Jose Sharks training facility and includes skating, training, and conditioning amenities to support the National Hockey League team. Additionally, the facility serves as the training site for the San Jose Barracuda, the Sharks American Hockey League affiliate that plays its home games at SAP Center at San Jose.

Sharks Ice at San Jose remained open during the pandemic while following City and county mandates and safety protocols. This included youth cohorts, capacity limitations, no event spectators, and employing mask and vaccine requirements. Despite this challenging environment, patrons showed their passion and loyalty with strong participation in programs that were hosted both outside and inside the facility in a safe, innovative, and limited fashion. As a result, over 2,000 participants attended hockey camps and clinics while 9,500 skaters enjoyed public skating sessions.

The expansion of the ice facility, which includes adding one ice rink (rink 5) and a 4,200-seat arena, continued in 2021. Erecting walls, expanding the center's roof structure, and adding critical mechanical, electrical, and plumbing infrastructure were all completed during the year. In the coming months, rink 5 is scheduled for completion while the ice floor, arena bowl, and finishes are underway at the newly named Tech CU Arena. The arena is set to open in the summer of 2022 and will serve as the home of the San Jose Barracuda.

## San Jose State University Athletic Facilities

The cornerstone facility of San Jose State University Athletics is CEFCU Stadium. Over the years the stadium has been expanded in stages to accommodate up to 30,455 spectators. The stadium is home of the Spartan football team that competes in the Mountain West Conference. The multi-use facility has featured American international soccer matches; high school, college, and professional football games; concerts; religious convocations; and university commencement exercises. The versatility of CEFCU Stadium and the adjacent athletics facilities makes SJSU an attractive campus for the Spartans, as well as other college and professional sports organizations. CEFCU Stadium is

undergoing a major transformation by creating the 55,000 square-foot Spartan Athletics Center, the centerpiece to the Spartans' fully reimagined South Campus Athletics Complex.

The Center will provide new locker rooms, team lounges, and coaches' offices for the Spartans' football, men's and women's soccer programs, as well as a host of other services designed to benefit a broad range of constituents. From student-athletes to the general student-body to alumni and other friends of the university, the Spartan Athletics Center will become a hub of activity for South Campus. Other amenities include dining facilities, an auditorium, team meeting/conference rooms, athletic training services, and a sports nutrition station. Finally, premium viewing and hospitality areas will enhance CEFCU Stadium and elevate the quality of the game-day experience for the Spartans' top constituents.

In 2021, the four-story South Campus parking structure opened on the corner of South 10<sup>th</sup> and Alma Streets. This facility provides 1,500 parking spaces to the campus and the community. An artificial turf field was installed alongside the parking facility to provide additional recreating space for the SJSU student body.

The Spartans continue to host many events on South Campus with the Spartan Soccer, Tennis, and Softball facilities, and the most recent addition, Spartan Beach for the beach volleyball program. The baseball program is nearing the completion of the Spartan Baseball Practice Facility. It has been a period of unparalleled growth and renewal for facilities across the entire South Campus Athletic Complex.

## Office of Economic Development / Office of Cultural Affairs Special Events Team

As the City of San Jose safely welcomes the return of outdoor gatherings, the Office of Cultural Affairs Special Events Team is pleased to share that outdoor events continue to rise and is beginning to see pre-pandemic event numbers throughout San Jose. A busy upcoming event season brings back popular events of years past, along with new and engaging events for families to enjoy. With the transformation of South Campus over the past few years, OCA is quickly seeing the area develop into a highly desirable location for citywide and localized events.

As long-standing, in-person events returning to the South Campus area, San Jose State University's public parking structure is set to provide convenient parking for thousands of event attendees. With the renovations of many South Campus destinations and the anticipated increase of permitted events in the area, OCA has worked with SCOT partners to enhance operational measures to accommodate the increased activity. The Office of Cultural Affairs is firmly committed to support the dynamic make-up of the South Campus and looks forward to highlighting the area through engaging, diverse, and culturally-rich events.

## Fire Department Training Center and Emergency Operations Center Project

In March 2021 the City of San Jose started on the construction of the new Fire Department Training Center and the Emergency Operations Center project on the recently purchased 4.5-acre Union Pacific railroad property, while incorporating a portion of the existing Central Service Yard (CSY) to accommodate the project.

The project consists of a total of five new buildings and the renovation of an existing building at the City's South Campus area Central Service Yard. The complex includes two large office-type buildings, with a two-story building being used by Fire Training Department recruits and trainers, and a separate portion of the building for Office of Emergency Management (OEM) personnel. Both

departments will share the classrooms and various amenities during emergency event management as well as regular business operations. The second single-story facility will serve primarily as the Emergency Operations Center for the City. A third unconditioned building is the Fire Department's seven-story fire training tower, along with two smaller single-story structures designated for fire drill activities. An existing building adjacent to the area within the CSY is being upgraded and remodeled for the Fire Department to store equipment and vehicles that will be used for training purposes.

Project construction followed the county mandates and protocols to maintain a COVID-free construction site. The Department of Public Works is managing the construction of the new complex, and it is expected to be completed by Spring of 2023.

### Conclusion

As illustrated in this summary, even under extraordinary circumstances, the South Campus area continues to be a highly active regional destination for San Jose. The Team worked diligently during the pandemic to provide a respite for those wanting to enjoy the area's many amenities, enhancing the South Campus area's standing as one of the leading attractions in the Bay Area.

# SAN JOSE ARENA AUTHORITY FY 2022-23 OPERATING BUDGET
