## **Ballot Measure Options**

Type of Measure	Votes Necessary to Pass	Restrictions
Municipal General Obligation Bond	2/3	Acquisition of real property or improvement of real property only
Parcel Tax for General or Special Purposes	2/3	Any municipal purpose. Tax cannot be based on <b>value</b> of property.
Any general tax except local sales tax (Transactions and Use tax)	50% + 1 vote	Any municipal purpose.
Any special tax except local sales tax (Transactions and Use tax)	2/3	Municipal purpose defined in the measure.
General local sales tax*	50% + 1 vote	Any municipal purpose. (Subject to rate limitations.)
Special local sales tax*	2/3	Municipal purpose defined in the measure. (Subject to rate limitations.)

\*San José has no additional sales tax capacity. It would require an act of the State Legislature to increase.



## **Recent Actions Taken**

- Citywide polling commenced in January 2022
- Four parcel tax measures tested: Parks (2), Neighborhood Improvements/BeautifySJ (1), Clean Creeks (1)
- Initial polling showed low receptivity, difficulty meeting 2/3 threshold
- Polling suspended to save resources, consider November options
- Key concerns:
  - $\circ$  COVID-19 fatigue
  - $\odot$  Increasing housing costs
  - $\ensuremath{\circ}$  Increasing costs for gasoline, utilities, and food
  - $\odot$  Concerns about inflation and future recession



## **Future Steps**

- Continue fostering awareness about how Parks & Recreation serves the community
- Engage and educate key stakeholders about existing commitments and community expectations in view of resource/sustainability issues and needs
- Explore creative funding options to advance when the time is right
- Resume polling in mid- to late 2023
