Dear Mayor Liccardo and Members of the City Council:

On today's City Council agenda, the Council will discuss and vote on a 4.6% raise for Code Enforcement Inspectors; I'm contacting you to ask you to vote on a raise which is fair and realistic when compared to our colleagues in the South Bay. Currently, the Code Enforcement Division is understaffed with a dedicated team of Inspectors committed to improving the quality of life for San Jose residents. The following is a comparison range for Code Enforcement Inspectors from other jurisdictions. As you can see, the City of San Jose, with the 4.6% proposed raise, still leaves the City of San Jose as the lowest paying municipality.

As we are aware, the City of San Jose is a challenge for folks to survive; please do what you can to increase the salaries for Code Enforcement Inspectors in San Jose.
