

Serving and Investing in Our Most Vulnerable

Action	Impact
Food Distribution Program	Provided over 106 million meals
Eviction Help Centers	Assisted at least 1,500 households at risk of eviction
Hotspots	3,200-3,600 hotspots to schools for students in need
	4,700 hotspots circulated to general public through San José Public Library

		Served 205 young adults
	Resilience Corps	>85% of the participants were from low resource census tracts
		~93% are Black, Indigenous, and people of color
		1^{st} grant round = 3,215 broadband adoptions
	Digital Inclusion Fund	2^{nd} grant round = 926 adoptions (pending)
		3^{rd} grant round = 2,150 adoptions (goal)
