Dear Mayor Liccardo and Councilmembers,

Green Foothills has long opposed the environmentally-destructive "Breeze of Innovation" proposal for a 200-foot tall light-pollution source bordering the sensitive riparian zones of both Los Gatos Creek and Guadalupe River. We provided a quote in the May 11 San Jose Spotlight article to that fact, saying "Our concern has always been that nighttime lighting next to the creek corridor will negatively impact local species, particularly insects and birds. This is inexcusable, especially on public parkland, with the global biodiversity crisis we are facing."

It's not just us. A recent Green Foothills Facebook post attracted substantial public support as well:

Human beings love the light, but it's possible to have too much of a good thing. @CityofSanJose's proposal for a 200-foot tall, decorative light tower on Arena Green is a big mistake! The tower would be located at the meeting point of Los Gatos Creek and the Guadalupe River, currently home to fish, birds, and other wildlife that would be harmed by powerful nighttime lights.

San Jose has invested in making Guadalupe River Park a haven for nature, so placing a huge nighttime light installation there makes no sense. Plants and animals depend on Earth's daily cycle of light and dark to govern life-sustaining behaviors such as reproduction, nourishment, sleep and protection from predators. Artificial light at night has negative and deadly effects on many creatures including amphibians, birds, mammals, insects and plants.

What is your plan for this?

San Jose, the 10th largest city in the U.S., is facing a reckoning with its homeless crisis that has exploded in recent years. In 2019, the city saw a 40% jump in the unhoused population—from 4,350 to 6,097. Santa Clara County experienced a 31% jump during the same period from 7,394 to 9,706.

Why do you allow housing increase of 10% while most jobs only give 3% raises? Why aren't rent increases capped at 3-5% ?

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
