## SUPPLEMENTAL

### REASON FOR SUPPLEMENTAL

This supplemental memorandum reports on the written protests received to date in response to mailed public notices regarding the proposed Municipal Water System rates effective July 1, 2022.

### ANALYSIS

Public notices were mailed to 25,898 potable water customers and 230 recycled water customers advising them that a hearing would be held on June 7, 2022, prior to City Council consideration of Municipal Water System rates effective July 1, 2022. In accordance with Proposition 218, customers were given at least 45 days to file written protests of the proposed rate increase.

As of end of the business day on Tuesday, May 31, 2022, the City Clerk's Office has received 75 protests in response to the potable water public notice, which represents less than one percent of all customers impacted by the change in water retail rates. The City Clerk's Office has not received any protests in response to the recycled water public notice. Protest letters may be submitted through the close of the Public Hearing, at which point the City Clerk will provide a count of all protests received during the protest period.
