BACKGROUND

August 24 celebrates Ukrainian Independence Day. This is the main state holiday in modern Ukraine, commemorating their Declaration of Independence in 1991. Over 4,000 Ukrainians call San José home and more than 20,000 live in the Bay Area. By raising the Ukrainian flag over San José City Hall, we symbolize our solidarity with Ukraine's independent and Democratic government. Nova Ukraine, a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing humanitarian aid to the people of Ukraine estimates that approximately 25,000 Ukrainian refugees are now residing in the Bay Area. The reason so many refugees recently came to the Bay Area is because they were forced to flee their homeland due to the invasion of their country by the Russian military. We stand strongly with the people of Ukraine and against the atrocities perpetrated by Russia's military aggression.
