State law requires that the City's Housing Element be adopted by City Council and submitted to the State by Jan. 31, 2023. Staff has submitted the draft Housing
Element to the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) and is anticipating an initial response and comments in December 2022. Staff will be
assessing and responding to these comments through January 2023 with the intent of resubmitting the second draft in early February. Assessment of the comments
from HCD and the preparation of a council discussion will pull staff resources away from preparing a second draft for review by HCD. Currently staff's workplan
anticipates final adoption of the proposed Housing Element in June of 2023 and any additional delay would push back the final adoption by City Council until
August of 2023, potentially further jeopardizing the City's eligibility for State and Federal grant programs. Staff will work with the City Manager's Office to plan a
potential date to bring this discussion back to Council, being mindful of minimizing significant impacts to the final approval date.
